Markets

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 19. (A. P.)—Whether the local turkey market is about to break sharply downward or remain merely a bit unsteady is a question which local poultry wholesalers and commission houses are unable to answer. The tone of the market is decidedly weak with best offerings bringing around 38c top. Receipts today and yesterday were heavy while demand is still rather limited with no large buyers in the market. In some quarters it is feared that prices will be down considerably unless demand increases substantially as indications are that receipts will increase steadily until after the holidays.

Country dressed meats are firm with the exception of slightly easier prices in the hog division. Best light hogs are moving easily around 12 1/2c. Veal is steady around 17@18c. Butter and egg prices are unchanged with trading in good volume. The butterfat market is a trifle unsettled with most buyers offering 51c per pound although some offerings run as high as 56c for Portland.
