DAVE SHADE WINS FIGHT

CONY ISLAND, June 15. (U P)—Dave Shade, California middleweight, won the judges' decision from George Courtney of Oklahoma in a 10-round bout at the Cony Island stadium tonight by a sensational comeback in the final rounds.

Shade weighed 158½, Courtney, 160½. A crowd of 9,000 saw Shade, wearing a bloody mask, launch a two-fisted attack in the sixth round, which he kept up until the final bell.

A large crowd of fans gathered around the ring to protest the decision. Courtney, disgusted with the verdict, threw off his robe and appealed to the crowd with open arms.

It was all Courtney's fight for the first five rounds. Courtney opened a cut on Shade's nose in the fifth round, which dripped blood throughout the rest of the fight.

Shade had Courtney on the run in the sixth round. Coming out for the ninth Courtney ran into a stiff left jab and had an ugly gash opened under his nose.

The referee had to warn both fighters repeatedly for hitting low, and hitting on the break, with Shade the principal offender.

By winning, Shade is the leading challenger in the eyes of the New York state athletic commission for Mickey Walker's middleweight title.

Harold Mays, New Jersey, 152½, defeated Benny Touchstone, Miami, Fla., 159, in the 8-round semi-final.

Amateurs Lead Field in N. W. Golf Tourney

PORTLAND, Ore., June 15. (U P)—Three amateurs led the field at the conclusion of the first 36 holes of the 72-hole Pacific Northwest open championship today.

Frank Dolp and Dr. O. F. Willing, both of Portland, and Lawson Little, San Francisco, finished the day's round with a total of 148 strokes.

Three professionals and two amateurs trailed the leaders with 149's. They were Walter Pursey, defending champion; Johnny Rebstock, John Junor, Phil Taylor and Roy Moe.

Of the 32 divot diggers who qualified today, only three were able to make the difficult Portland Country Club course in par figures. Rudie Wilhelm, Portland, Pacific Northwest champion; Asa Smith, Portland amateur, and Taylor, the Victoria professional, managed to get over the fairways for par 72's.

Doe Moe, Oregon state amateur champion, slipped badly in the afternoon round, taking a 79, three strokes more than his morning total.

Carley Houston, Seattle, was forced to drop out at the 13th hole during the morning round when he complained of illness.

The final 36 holes will be played tomorrow.

Mickey Training For Hudkins Bout

CHICAGO, June 15. (U P)—Mickey Walker, middleweight champion, fresh from a day's lay-off, went through the most strenuous day of sparring since he started training here for his bout June 21 with Ace Hudkins of Nebraska.

The champion took on five sparring partners at his camp today to make up for the rest he took Thursday. Walker, who says he now is ready to enter the ring, laid off Thursday to prevent staleness.

Hudkins worked out with three of his sparring mates today. He is outwardly confident of whipping Walker and announced today after his workout that he would give the champion "the worst beating of his life."

BUENOS AIRES, June 15. (U P)—Monte Munn, Nebraska heavyweight, and Clemente Sanchez of Cuba completed training today for their heavyweight bout Saturday. Munn is favored to win.

Risko Scheduled To Meet Godfrey

NEW YORK, June 15. (U P)—Johnny Risko, Cleveland heavyweight, weighed 191 pounds after a strenuous workout today for his 10-round match Wednesday night with George Godfrey, the Lelperville negro. Risko boxed the equivalent of 10 rounds and did six miles of road work.

OKLAHOMA CITY, Okla., June 15.—Clyde Evans of Portland, Ore., was elected president of the Travelers' Protective association of America today at the closing convention held here. Detroit was selected as the next meeting place.
