

Giants Slip to Rear in Tangle With Cardinals

(By the United Press)

Home runs blasted the New York Giants out of second place in the National league pennant race Tuesday, the St. Louis Cardinals scoring a 5 to 1 victory over the Giants and increasing their lead to 5½ games.

Andy Hib hit two home runs, Chic Hafey and George Harper one each off Joe Genewich to account for all five St. Louis runs. With the score tied 1-1, Hib, Hafey and Harper hit homers in the sixth inning.

The Cincinnati Reds piled up 15 hits and a 12 to 4 victory over the Brooklyn Robins. It was the Reds' seventh straight victory and hoisted Cincinnati to second place.

Paul Waner's single in the ninth drove home the winning run and the Pittsburgh Pirates won their fourth straight game, beating the Philadelphia Phillies 6 to 5.

Rogers Hornsby tied the score with a home run in the ninth, but the Chicago Cubs put over a run in their half of the same inning, beating the Boston Braves 7 to 6.

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Olympic Athletes Ready for Journey

NEW YORK, July 10, (UP)—

The S. S. Roosevelt rides at anchor in the New York harbor, ready to convey the 1928 United States Olympic team to Amsterdam.

Two hundred and sixty-eight strong, the 1928 team will sail at noon Wednesday and arrive nine days later to begin "the big drive" at Amsterdam July 29.

Representing the greatest collection of athletic talent ever gathered for one campaign, the United States has high hopes of another sweeping victory.

Coach Lawson Robertson of Pennsylvania rates the track and field strength of the 1928 team above all other teams and confidently looks forward to a better showing than at Paris in 1924 when Jackson V. Scholz won the only victory for the United States in flat racing.

America has strength all along the line on this year's team.

Four Teams Tied In Coast League

SAN FRANCISCO, July 10, (UP)—Four teams of the Pacific coast league were again tied for first place tonight due to victories of Seattle and the San Francisco Seals while Sacramento and Hollywood, leaders before the games started, were losing.

Seattle beat Hollywood, 4 to 2, while the Seals were defeating Sacramento, 6 to 5. Portland won the first game of the series with the San Francisco Missions, 5 to 3, and Los Angeles was the other victor, trouncing Oakland, 7 to 3.

The closest game of the day was played here. The score of the contest between the Seals and the Senators was tied, each team having five runs, after he seventh inning. Jolley, Seal right fielder, hit a home run in the last of the eighth and it decided the encounter.

Seattle scored once in the second, fifth, seventh and eighth innings, while the Stars made two runs in the second for their total. The contest between Los Angeles and Oakland was decided in the first inning when the Angels scored four times.

The mayor, "wise cracking" and apparently in high spirits, was late to the luncheon and took occasion to explain his proverbial tardiness. He claimed that he had formed the habit of being late because the New York newspapers always started their stories of his speeches by saying "The mayor, as usual, was late," and he then had to be late to keep the stories, written in advance, from being wrong.

Walker was offered a motion picture contract with "\$10,000 weekly, movie money," but rejected the offer because "there isn't enough money in California to make the mayor New York be on time," as provided in a clause of the document.

Coleen Moore, Corrine Griffith and other noted stars were in the group that listened to the address.

Mayor Walker was introduced by Ned Marin, First National producer, a friend of long standing. Marin emphatically stated that politics would have and could have no place in the motion picture industry.

He denied that any influence could be brought to bear that would curtail individual thinking on political subjects within the picture business.

Throughout Walker's address ran the theme that the motion pictures had not been fair to his friend, Governor Smith.

He made a plea for independent thinking as "the very basis on which our country was founded."

"It may be," he continued, "that this year, after 150 years of struggle to maintain our principles, we are facing a crisis to determine whether such free thinkers as Washington, Jefferson and Jackson were right."

"Any attempt to stifle our thoughts or political, religious or social liberty is an attempt to make a farce of the constitution."

While he carefully refrained from mentioning names, his hearers believed the mayor directed his remarks at executives in the industry who are prominent politically, including WH Hays, Schenck and Mayer.
