

CHAMP TAKES HEAVY WORK

SPECULATOR, N. Y., July 17. (UP)—Gene Tunney swung back into his regular training routine today after loafing for 24 hours in an attempt to dull his fighting edge.

The heavyweight champion, who meets Tom Heeney in the Yankee Stadium, New York, on July 26, went through a brisk ring workout. Harold May and Billy Vidabek, his chief sparring partners, absorbed some stiff blows and handed a few back to Tunney.

Gene plans to do his last sparring Sunday or Monday. Always in splendid condition, Tunney cannot afford to work too hard from now on or he will find himself stale when he tries to retain his title.

The champion revealed today that he had no prejudice against shadow boxing as a means of getting into condition. But he does hate to do it in public.

"I usually shadow box when I am by myself on the road," he said.

Tunney is going in stronger for roadwork than in preparing for any previous bout. Monday he ran nine miles and did another four miles through the woods this morning. After Sunday he will get virtually all his exercise on the road.

Tex Rickard has become convinced that an airplane is about as safe as a train, so the last objection seems to have been removed to Tunney's proposal to fly from Speculator to New York with Commander Richard E. Byrd on the day of the bout. Tunney took a year or two off Rickard's life when he flew from Stroudsburg, Pa., to Philadelphia to win the championship from Jack Dempsey. The champion insists traveling by rail wears him out.

One Run Decides Three Games in Pacific League

SAN FRANCISCO, July 17. (UP)—Three contests of the Pacific Coast League were decided by a margin of one run today. Hollywood and Sacramento were among the victors and increased their lead of the circuit.

Hollywood beat the San Francisco Seals, 5 to 4, to remain two games ahead of Sacramento. The Seals made three runs in the first two innings and the other two in the seventh. Only one runner was on base when Averill hit a home run for the Seals in the ninth and it was the final threat of the losers.

The Senators also won by the narrow difference of a single run. They made six runs in the second inning and, although the Seattle Indians managed to cut this down entirely by the seventh inning, Sacramento scored once in the last of the seventh to win the game, 7 to 6.

The other close game was between Los Angeles and the San Francisco Missions, which the Angels won, 2 to 1. The Angels were out but they scored twice in the sixth inning and held the Missions to one run in the seventh inning.

Oakland trounced Portland, 8 to 3. The Oaks scored in five innings. Their fourth run was made in the fourth inning and they added four more in the sixth, seventh and eighth.

Heeney Getting In Shape for Go

FAIRHAVEN, N. J., July 17. (UP)—Now that Tom Heeney is hearing his fighting edge for the championship bout with Gene Tunney, he has decided to change his training routine.

Three days ago Heeney's managers announced the hard rock would work out at night under electric lights to accustom himself to the glare he will face when he crawls through the ropes at the Yankee Stadium. Heeney did—just once.

Then in his stolid English way, Heeney said he preferred to do his training in daylight. The night, he announced, was made for sleeping. John Mortimer, Heeney's manager acquiesced.

That was the keynote of Heeney's training for the last two days. Everybody is taking it easy and agreeing with the challenger. Boxing critics have been astounded because Heeney has not worked out on the heavy punching bag. How, they ask, can the Anzac hope to develop a knock-out punch unless he hammers something bigger than the small bag?

Heeney answered them. He isn't trying to develop a knock-out punch. It seems that years ago the challenger's shoulders became muscle bound because he failed to take a rubdown after playing rugby. Now he is afraid to wallow the big bag for fear of wrenching one of his shoulder muscles.

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Fight Postponed For Seventh Time
