Five Teams Train For November's Grid Offensives

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 29. (UP)—Five football teams of the Pacific Coast Conference today started the final week of practice before their November offensives which will determine the championship of the 10-college circuit.

In the San Francisco Bay region Stanford and California trained for the first time of the year on muddy conditions in preparation for the most important games of the week. Stanford will go south to Los Angeles this week-end to meet the University of Southern California, only undefeated team of the conference. The Cardinals have not been defeated in conference play, however, so the contest is one of four remaining games that will have direct bearing on the title.

"Pop" Warner's squad of Cardinals have been made favorites in early betting because two backfield combinations have proven they can execute Warner's tricky reverses with precision by rolling up 192 points against opponents.

The Golden Bears will meet University of Oregon, considered the strongest team in the Pacific northwest, at Berkeley Saturday. California is favored to win.

The contest between Washington State and Idaho, two colleges situated only 20 miles apart and consequently old rivals, will be played at Moscow Saturday. Washington State is in fourth place and a victory over Idaho will make its contest with U. S. C. on November 17 a decisive tilt. The fourth conference game this week-end will be between Oregon State and Montana at Corvallis.

Zeppelin on Way In Face of Storm

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hurst hangar. The stowaway Clarence Toxane—was reported in dispatches to Berlin newspapers as an adventurous youth of 17.

Apparently cruising at close to its normal speed of more than 60 miles an hour, the dirigible's progress was checked regularly until Dr. Hugo Eckener commander of the giant airship had turned its nose over the ocean and passed far out to sea. After noon today there were a number of vessels along the route keeping watch for the progress of the ship or communicating by radio with Dr. Eckener.

Passes Over New York After leaving Lakehurst under favorable weather conditions, the Graf Zeppelin cruised under a full moon toward New York and, with four of its five big motors singing a steady peaceful tune, passed over Broadway shortly after 3 a. m. A powerful beacon on the roof of a Brooklyn hotel touched the silver sides of the ship, a calm farewell in comparison to the shouting of thousands who saw the storm-battered dirigible slip over New York's towers on a dull grey afternoon two weeks ago.

Ships Report Storms Massachusetts, the dirigible apparently followed a due east course for the next few hours, being reported by the traveler Widgerson at 7:15 a. m. and by the S. S. American Trader at noon. The wind had increased slightly in velocity, blowing at about half-scale force, and the American Trader reported rain and squalls along the route.

The weather bureau reports indicated that Dr. Eckener would be forced to employ his greatest skill in escaping adverse weather, such as forced the dirigible far south of what would have been a normal course across the Atlantic on its trip two weeks ago.

Average Mill Stocks Low

In the first place, mill stocks have been steadily cut down since the beginning of May and the average concern is even today low on many of the most-called-for items of retail yard stock. With the footage being moved, the unsold lumber can be put in sheds and piles for the next three or four weeks without any inconvenience. In the meantime plans are taking shape for a production regulation through the winter months that will more than meet the falling off in buying during the season when outside construction work is down to a minimum. Prices on lumber have improved considerably this year, due entirely to a same sawing program which has prevented an oversupply and the manufacturers are determined not to lose the ground they have gained by overproduction when the consuming fields are tied up.

Reports from all districts show the retailers to be in the same frame of mind on buying now that they always are just prior to taking inventories. They have bought hand-to-mouth through the year and taken care of their business with quick shipments of hard assortments and this attitude has an extreme expression as the year closes and they desire to reduce the unsold stock down to a minimum.

Buying Precedes Shutdowns The psychological effect which the midwinter shutdowns on the Pacific coast has on the minds of the retail dealers has never failed to speed up placements just prior to inventory taking and to continue for some time afterwards. It is a fact that through more modern methods of building, which make provision for cold weather, there is a much better consumption of lumber in the winter months than there used to be.
