The past season only 60 acres of Ladino was grown in the county but the yields were so good, especially for pasture, that many farmers contemplate growing the clover this coming year, the county agent said. 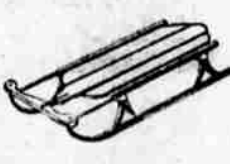
