Golfers to Meet for Opening Round

LOS ANGELES, Jan. 8. (UP)—Some 400 golfers will play over six different courses here Wednesday in the first 18-holes of the 36-hole qualifying round for the Los Angeles \$10,000 open tournament.

The first 14 and ties at each course, together with those exempted from qualifying because they finished among the first 20 in the National Open or in the Los Angeles Open last year, will start the 72-hole event proper Friday.

Walter Hagen, the British open champion, has been established a decided favorite to take first money.

Leo Diegel, who won the San Diego open, also has entered the front rank. Horton Smith, the young Joplin, Mo., star who won the Catalina open, and Tommy Armour, who finished first at Sacramento, also are expected to be near the top.

Griffiths Wins Easy Knockout Over G. O. Gemas

CHICAGO, Jan. 8. (UP)—

Tuffy Griffiths, Sioux City, Iowa, won an easy knockout victory here tonight when he stopped George Gemas after one minute and 54 seconds of the second round. The bout was scheduled for 10 rounds.

Griffiths floored Gemas seven times in the first round and three times in the second before the Philadelphia heavyweight stayed down for the count.

Gemas demonstrated that he was game but he was no match

for the tough Sioux City boy and despite his willingness to slug, he landed few blows.

The Philadelphia charged Griffiths each time he got up but consistently ran into a stiff right-hand punch.

Results of the preliminaries: Eddie Ballatin defeated Jack Moore, technical knockout sixth round. Referee stopped the fight when Moore came out for sixth round with badly cut eye. 140 pounds.

"Babe" Deconsey won in the first round from Jack Moran. Wally Elkins lost a four-round decision to Jerry Sullivan, 173 pounds.

King Levinski beat Sam Curtis, four rounds.

Riegels Name Forgotten With 'Bonehead' Play Only Week Old

CHICAGO, Jan. 8. (UP)—

There is a baseball theory that the name of a player who hits a "bonehead" play rarely is forgotten, but it would appear from interviews in Chicago's loop today that this theory does not hold true in football.

On New Year's day, a California football player carried the ball more than 40 yards in the wrong direction. That play allowed Georgia Tech to win and
