P)—Work has been started and
is scheduled to end in 60 days
on the \$1,500,000 Richfield Oil
company plant near Linton, ac-
cording to J. W. Peak. The J.

the plant construction.

174,000 gallons storage capacity
in five tanks. A seawall will be
constructed for a 700-foot river
frontage.
