RESOLUTION OF INTENTION

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION TO CONSTRUCT A SEWER IN PORTIONS OF THE ORIGINAL TOWN, EWAUNA HEIGHTS, FIRST ADDITION AND BUENA VISTA ADDITION TO THE CITY OF KLAMATH FALLS, BEING KNOWN AS SEWER UNIT NO. NINE.

The City Engineer, pursuant to a resolution of the Common Council heretofore adopted, having on the 7th day of January, 1929, filed his plans and specifications and estimates for the cost of installing said sewer unit, which is known as the 9th sewer unit, in portions of the original town, Ewauna Heights, First Addition and Buena Vista Addition to the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, embracing in said unit all of the property hereinafter bounded and described, and the council having taken the same under advisement and finding said plans, specifications and estimates satisfactory.

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that the said plans, specifications and estimates for the construction and installing and making of what is known as the 9th sewer unit, be and the same are hereby approved.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Common Council hereby declares its intention to construct and install the 9th sewer unit in accordance with the said plans, specifications and estimates; that said sewer unit shall be constructed by placing therein salt glazed vitrified sewer pipes with "Y's", manholes, lamp holes, and the like; or concrete sewer pipes made according to specifications for cement concrete sewer pipes as all more fully shown on the said plans and specifications on file with the Police Judge, at a total estimated cost of fifty-three thousand eight-hundred and eighty-four dollars (\$53,884.00) for vitrified pipes and fifty-three thousand eight-hundred and eighty-four dollars (\$53,884.00) for concrete pipes; said estimates in either event to include engineering supervision, advertising, clerical assistance and unforeseen contingencies.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Common Council that the property hereinafter described be and is hereby declared to be benefited by the construction and installation of said sewer system to-wit: All of the property embraced within the following boundaries, to-wit:

Beginning at the most southerly corner of block 25 of the original town of Klamath Falls,

Oregon; thence northeasterly along the northerly line of Main street to the most easterly corner of block 24 of the original town of Klamath Falls; thence northeasterly along the easterly line of block 24 of the original town to the most northerly corner of lot 6, block 2, of the original town; thence northerly across High street to the most easterly corner of lot 1, block 3, of Ewauna Heights Addition to the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon; thence northeasterly along the southeasterly line of Ewauna Heights Addition to the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon; thence northeasterly along the southeasterly line of Jefferson street to the line between lots 3 and 4, block 15, Ewauna Heights Addition; thence northeasterly along said line to a point on the northeasterly line of Lincoln street between lots 3 and 4, block 17, Ewauna Heights Addition; thence northeasterly along said line to the most easterly corner of lot 19, block 27, First Addition to the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon; thence northeasterly along the southeasterly line of 4th street to the center line of the alley in block 27, First Addition; thence northeasterly along the center line of the alley through blocks 26 and 25, First Addition to the southeasterly line of 6th street; thence northeasterly along the southeasterly line of 6th street to the most easterly corner of lot 19, block 30, First Addition; thence northeasterly along the southeasterly line of Grant street to the southeasterly line of 7th street; thence northeasterly along the southeasterly line of 7th street to the most easterly corner of lot 9, block 3, First Addition; thence northeasterly along the southeasterly line of Doty street to the most easterly corner of lot 6, block 5, First Addition; thence westerly along the southerly line of Upham street to the easterly line of Verlingas street; thence southerly along said line to the most westerly corner of block 2, First Addition; thence westerly across Verlingas street and along the southerly line of Cook street to the line between lots 1 and 9, block 56, of Buena Vista Addition to the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon; thence southerly along said line to the northerly line of Doty street; thence westerly along the northerly line of Doty street to the southwest corner of lot 4, block 110, Buena Vista Addition; thence westerly across Buena street to the line between lots 25 and 26, block 108, Buena Vista Addition; thence westerly along said line to the center line of the alley in block 108; thence northerly along the center line of the alley through block 108 to the southerly line of Cook street; thence northerly across Cook street and along the center line of block 128, Buena Vista Addition to the southerly line of Upham street; thence westerly along said line to the most westerly corner of lot 1, block 148, Buena Vista Addition; thence southerly along the easterly line of Bluff street to the northerly line of Cook street; thence easterly across Cook street to the most northerly corner of lot 4, block 150, Buena Vista Addition; thence southerly along the westerly line of Stanford street to the southerly corner of lot 11, block 151, Buena Vista Addition; thence southeasterly across lot 12, block 151, Buena Vista Addition to the most southerly corner of block 194, Buena Vista Addition; thence southeasterly along the northeasterly line of Conger avenue to the point of beginning.

That portion of Oak avenue, 60 feet in width, which extends through blocks 9 and 10 of Industrial Addition to the City of Klamath Falls, County of Klamath, State of Oregon, more particularly described as follows:

Lloyd said in the double grave he found two holes—cup-like in shape—indicating, in his opinion, that two heads had at one time rested in the soft earth.

In the single grave he declared he found a quantity of lime.

Accused Father

The young defendant-attorney brought out in the cross examination that his father, Cyrus Northcott, had taken the time to the ranch and knew what it was to be used for.

Lloyd further related that he found a cap on the ranch that was identified by N. H. Winslow of Pomona, as belonging to either of his boys—Nelson and Lewis—two of Northcott's asserted victims of abuse and axe.
