Basin Mill Men Attend Session In Longview, Wn.

Klamath was well represented at the first sawmill engineering conference ever to be held on the coast, which opened Wednesday morning in Longview, Wash., and ended Thursday night.

Seven men, prominently identified with the Klamath basin pine industry, attended the session. They included E. A. Blockinger, president and owner of the Chiloquin Lumber company; Matt Egan, manager of the Algonquin Lumber company; P. T. Horn, manager of the Forest Lumber company; John Fossum, connected with the Rio Tinto Box company; Edward H. Pico, mill superintendent for the Pelican Bay Lumber company; Walter Beane, of the Klamath Iron and Steel Works, and E. Hill Hunter, president of the Sawmill Engineering and Construction company.

Mr. Hunter, who returned yesterday from Longview, was heard in his praise of the conference.

"It was the first meeting of its kind ever held on the Pacific coast," he said. "Believe it or not, one manufacturer of mill materials came all the way from Austria to attend. One blue manufacturer journeyed from North Dakota. Purpose of the session was to exchange practical and theoretical ideas on how to make better lumber—not more lumber, you understand, but better lumber."
