RESOLUTION OF INTENTION

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION TO CONSTRUCT A SEWER IN PORTIONS OF THE ORIGINAL TOWN, EWAUNA HEIGHTS, FIRST ADDITION AND BUENA VISTA ADDITION TO THE CITY OF KLAMATH FALLS TO BE KNOWN AS SEWER UNIT NO. NINE.

The City Engineer, pursuant to a resolution of the Common Council heretofore adopted, having on the 7th day of January, 1929, filed his plans and specifications and estimates for the cost of installing and making what is known as the 9th sewer unit in portions of the original town, Ewauna Heights, First Addition and Buena Vista Addition to the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, embracing in said unit all of the property hereinafter bounded and described, and the council having taken the same under advisement and finding said plans, specifications and estimates satisfactory.

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that the said plans, specifications and estimates for the construction and installing and making of what is known as the 9th sewer unit, be and the same are hereby approved.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Common Council hereby declares its intention to construct and install the 9th sewer unit in accordance with the said plans, specifications and estimates; that said sewer unit shall be constructed by placing therein suitably vitrified sewer pipes with "Y's", manholes, lamp holes, and the like; or concrete sewer pipes made according to specifications for cement concrete sewer pipes all as more fully shown on the said plans and specifications on file with the Police Judge, at a total estimated cost of fifty-three thousand eight-hundred and eighty-nine dollars (\$53,889.00) for vitrified pipes and fifty-three thousand eight-hundred and eighty-nine dollars (\$53,889.00) for concrete pipes; said estimates in either event to include engineering supervision, advertising, clerical assistance and unforeseen contingencies.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Common Council that the property hereinafter described be and is hereby declared to be benefited by the construction and installation of said sewer system to-wit: All of the property embraced within the following boundaries, to-wit:

Beginning at the most southerly corner of block 25 of the original town of Klamath Falls, Oregon; thence northeasterly along the northerly line of Main street to the most easterly corner of block 24 of the original town of Klamath Falls; thence northeasterly along the easterly line of block 24 of the original town to the most northerly corner of lot 6, block 2, of the original town; thence northerly across High street to the most easterly corner of lot 1, block 3, of Ewauna Heights Addition to the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon; thence northeasterly along the southerly line of Ewauna Blvd. to the most easterly corner of lot 1, block 13, Ewauna Heights Addition; thence northeasterly along the northerly line of Jefferson street to the line between lots 3 and 4, block 15, Ewauna Heights Addition; thence northeasterly along said lot line to a point on the northeasterly line of Lincoln street

between lots 3 and 4, block 17, Ewauna Heights Addition; thence northeasterly along said lot line to the most easterly corner of lot 16, block 37, First Addition, to the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon; thence northeasterly along the southerly line of 4th street to the center line of the alley in block 37, First Addition; thence northeasterly along the center line of the alley through blocks 26 and 35, First Addition to the southerly line of 6th street; thence northeasterly along the southerly line of 6th street to the most easterly corner of lot 16, block 39, First Addition; thence northeasterly along the northerly line of Grant street to the southerly line of 7th street; thence northeasterly along the southerly line of 7th street to the most easterly corner of lot 9, block 2, First Addition; thence northeasterly along the northerly line of Doty street to the most easterly corner of lot 6, block 5, First Addition; thence southerly along the southerly line of Upman street to the easterly line of Corliss street; thence southerly along said lot line to the most easterly corner of block 3, First Addition; thence southerly across Corliss street and along the southerly line of Cook street to the line between lots 1 and 5, block 96, of Buena Vista Addition to the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon; thence southerly along said lot line to the northerly line of Doty street; thence westerly along the northerly line of Doty street to the southwest

corner of lot 4, block 116, Buena Vista Addition; thence westerly across Buena street to the line between lots 25 and 26, block 168, Buena Vista Addition; thence westerly along said lot line to the center line of the alley in block 168; thence northerly along center line of the alley through block 168 to the southerly line of Cook street; thence northerly across Cook street and along the center line of block 128, Buena Vista Addition to the southerly line of Uppham street; thence westerly along said lot line to the most westerly corner of lot 1, block 145, Buena Vista Addition; thence southerly along the easterly line of Buuff street to the northerly line of Cook street; thence easterly across Cook street to the most northerly corner of lot 4, block 150, Buena Vista Addition; thence southerly along the westerly line of Stanford street to the southerly corner of lot 11, block 151, Buena Vista Addition; thence southerly across lot 12, block 151, Buena Vista Addition, and across the unplatted portion of block 164, Buena Vista Addition to the most southerly corner of block 164, Buena Vista Addition; thence southerly along the northeasterly line of Conner avenue to the point of beginning.

Said property above described shall be and the same is hereby declared to be benefited and assessed for the expense of said sewer unit.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Monday the 11th day of

February, 1929, at the hour of 3 o'clock, p.m., at the council chambers in the city hall of Klamath Falls, Oregon, be filed as the time and place for hearing objections or remonstrances against the construction and installation of said sewer unit.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Police Judge be and he is hereby authorized and directed to cause notice of said hearing to be published as provided by the city charter.
