Hauger Wins Class A Event With 98 Out of 100 At 16 Yards

Twenty-one marksmen participated in the registered trap shoot Sunday at the Klamath Gun Club grounds. M. E. Hauger won the class A trophy, with a score of 98 out of a possible 100 targets at 16 yards.

Trophies of silver loving cups were given the winners in each division.

W. E. Lamm won a trophy of a supply of shells by taking the handicap event of 30 targets with a score of 43 out of 50. He was shooting at 22 yards.

Ernest Nitschke and Bill Houston tied for first place in the doubles with scores of 22 out of a possible 24 each. To decide the winner of the trophy of shells a coin was tossed and the ammunition went to Houston.

MIAMI BEACH, Fla., Feb. 25 (UP)—What with mysterious prowl taking pot shots at Jack Dempsey and Young Stribling yesterday one of his ribs, the forthcoming heavyweight battle beneath the palms all but lost a couple of its principal participants today.

The shot in the night which started the ex-champion remains a mystery, but Stribling's rib is back to place, and as far as can be foreseen the Dempsey-Sharkey engagement with Jack Sharkey will take place as scheduled.

Shooting "Fifty"

There is something exceedingly "fifty" about the Dempsey shooting incident, but since Dempsey says it's so, that ends the matter as far as anyone weighing less than 196 pounds is concerned.

The deliberation of one of Young Stribling's ribs, on the other hand, was a far more serious affair. It happened six days ago, but was hushed up to avoid reports that the fight would have to be postponed.

Stribling, in boxing, threw one of the ribs on his left side out of place. The injury was repaired easily enough, but neither set in, painted in itself and a handicap to a boxer who is preparing for the most important event of his career.

Sharkey Should Win

The splendid physical condition of the younger, who has been an acrobat and athlete all his life, pulled him through, and this afternoon "Pete" Stribling declared his boy to be the best of shape for the fight on Wednesday night.

Naturally the accident lengthened the odds favoring Sharkey. He and his handlers are exceedingly confident. The Lithuanian worked out today, while Stribling rested.

The Boston heavyweight is a fine figure of a fighting man, and should win this fight with ease.

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JACK DEMPSEY ENDANGERED BY STRAY SHOT

Ex-Champ and Fitzsimmons Describe Alleged Shooting

MIAMI BEACH, Fla., Feb. 25 (UP)—Jack Dempsey believes he escaped possible kidnapping and perhaps serious injury today only because an assailant who fired one shot at him was a poor marksman or had a fatal heart.

Dempsey and Floyd Fitzsimmons, fight promoter, reported they found an intruder in their room at the Morrison Hotel, Chicago, early today. When Dempsey started in pursuit of him, the intruder fired a single shot at the former heavyweight champion, Dempsey and Fitzsimmons said, apparently linked around the Morrison mansion for a half hour in hopes that Dempsey would come out.

Delays Report to Police

For that half hour Dempsey and Fitzsimmons described themselves virtual prisoners in their room, which had no telephone connection. They were unarmed, only when they saw an automobile parked across the street flash a light as if to signal, and then a few minutes later two men drove away, did they feel safe to leave the room.

No one else in the house seemed to have heard the shot.

Dempsey did not report the affair to Miami Beach police until nearly noon.

"I wanted to keep it quiet," he said. "There wasn't anything to be done about it."

"I had come to bed about midnight. There were twin beds in the room. Fitzsimmons had the one near the wall and I had the other."

Jack's Story

"About 5 o'clock I woke up and there was a fellow in the room. He was a little chap, I don't think he was more than five feet two. He ordered me to turn on the lights. I did and he shouted, 'Come on, Joe,' and I jumped out of bed. He started out the door and I slammed it shut and then ran round through the bathroom and into the hall. When I was at the head of the stairs I could see the fellow getting out through a window. Just then he shot. The bullet missed and hit the wall about four feet from the floor."

"I didn't have any gun or anything else and when he began to shoot I bent it back to the room and stayed there. About half an hour later Fitzsimmons and I saw some light flash on the car parked across the street and then two men drove away."

Fitzsimmons' Version

"I don't know what it was about but the fellow didn't seem to want money. He didn't demand anything and he didn't take any of the money that was on the dresser. All I can think is that he might have thought he could take me for a ride."

Fitzsimmons' account of the affair was much more picturesque and detailed.

"All I can figure is that he was going to kidnap Jack and either beat him or maybe kill him or ransom him out of him some way," the promoter said.

Picturesque Account

"I heard the fellow come in the room and I watched him sneak across the floor over to Jack's bed and lean over."

"I watched him for four or five minutes. I could see a gun in his hand. I called 'What in hell do you want?' The fellow said, 'Turn on the lights.' I thought Jack was asleep, but he wasn't and he snapped the light on. The fellow yelled 'Come on, Joe,' and he came out in the hall. He backed toward the door, which opened inward, as he opened Jack jumped out of bed, slammed the door shut, shoving the chair out of the room. "That's the bullet," Dempsey said. "When Jack shot he heard the fellow fired. He missed but Jack ran back into the room and we didn't dare go out until we had a half hour because we didn't know where the fellow was and we had no way to defend ourselves. Then we saw two men drive away in a car."

Fitzsimmons, who is a character well known in sporting circles, rushed into his rear pocket and pulled out a flattened piece of lead.

"Here it is," he said. "That's the bullet that might have killed Jack Dempsey. That's it right there."
