

Sharkey Wins Over Stribling After Slow Ten Round Fight

had hoped that he might prove his first heavyweight champion. The Georgian, spotting his opponent a ten-pound weight advantage, chose to keep well away from the Bostonian for most of the fight, and his lack of fighting spirit probably did much to cost him the verdict.

Log Magnolia, the referee, had no hesitation in raising Sharkey's right hand as soon as the clamor of the bell announced the end of the tenth round, and from the vast throng, stretching from the 225 ring side seats to the far reaches up on the top of the DT section, there was hardly a dissenting voice.

Pa's Southpaws
The southerners are sportsmen, and they admitted the Bostonian was the better man. "Pa" Stribling raised his voice in protest, but "Pa's" sentiments are too well known to warrant much attention.

"My boy's left arm gave away entirely at the end of the fourth round, due to the neuritis which he suffered from last week," the older Stribling claimed. "W. L. fought a wonderful fight and was robbed of the decision."

"Why, Sharkey was a target for that left hand until it gave way."

Sharkey Takes Offensive
The truth of the matter is that Stribling was a target for Sharkey's fast left jab, which drew blood from the Georgian's nose and mouth and kept him backpedaling throughout most of the fight.

Round after round Sharkey stepped in, leading and jabbing with a snake-like left hand, and Stribling stepped backward, backing away, watching for a chance to jump in with his pile-driving right.

Stribling Warned
Because of the light-footed defensive tactics of the southerner, Sharkey did not always show to advantage. There were times, too, when he was caught by surprise by a lightning-like charge, which ended with the five-ounce red gloves of Stribling beating into his face.

Repeatedly throughout the bout Stribling had to be warned by the referee, now for hitting low, now for using wrestling tactics in the clinches, when he bore his heavier opponent back against the ropes.

Stribling Hangs On
Sharkey kept his temper, bided his time and scored with right uppercuts to the body.
For the most part, however, it was a sparring match. Only once or twice would the Georgian open up, and when he did, he scored frequently. Sharkey relished such exchanges, and just when the going was getting good, Stribling folded up and hung on.

Card Pays Well
It was far from one of the Georgian's worst fights, however. If one is to credit his claim of physical handicap, it was one of his best. He all but held his own in the boxing, and the vast throng seemed to feel it had its money's worth.

The fight would have had to be better than this to justify the money, however, for 35,000 paid \$400,000 to see the show. Perhaps they didn't pay to see the show, but Jack Dempsey, debonair in his new role of promoter, W. F. Carey, genial guiding spirit of the affair, and all the celebrities at the ringside—celebrities such as Tex Rickard dreamed of when he planned this last fistic venture by the sea.

Preliminaries
Chick Newberry, of Ashbury Park, N. J., 156½, was knocked out by Texas Ranger, Fort Worth, Tex., 177½, in the third round of the first preliminary.
In the second preliminary Andy Callahan, clever little Lawrence, Mass., lightweight contender, scored a technical knockout over Joe McKenzie of Norfolk, Va., former champion of the Atlantic fleet, in the third round. Callahan weighed 139, his opponent 156.

Battle Royal
The next event was a battle royal, with 13 big negroes of various shades, blind-folded, all in the ring at once, and the crowd in hysterics.

The affair continued, with every man for himself, until there remained but two exhausted survivors, who divided a prize offered by Jack Dempsey.

Fashionably dressed women in the ringside seats shrieked with delight at the spectacle of the negroes hammering each other about the ring, spreading great clouds of resin dust over the aforementioned fashionable attire.

Ruth Helbo of Columbus, Ga., outpointed Mike Firpo of Tampa, Fla., in a four-round bout.
Abe Bain of Newark, N. J., 162½, knocked out Red Riley, Troy, N. Y., 160, after one minute and 35 seconds of fighting in the first round. A straight left to the jaw dropped Riley for the full count, after the Troy boy had taken a severe beating.

Fuente Victor
Tony Fuente of Mexico City, 125, went on in one of the last

of the preliminaries against Spike Webb, Orlando, Fla., 191.
The Florida boy quit cold in his own corner at the start of the fourth, Fuente setting in one right uppercut to the jaw which made Webb sit down suddenly after the referee had stopped the fight. The end came after one minute and 55 seconds of the fourth round.

Pat McCarthy of Boston, 175, spotted Sully Montgomery of Fort Worth, Tex., to a 24-round weight advantage and handed the former Center college football star a bad beating in four rounds.
During a preliminary in which Sid Terris of Mohave, N. C., 212, knocked out Paul Hoffman of Holland, 186, in the fourth round, Young Stribling entered the arena and took a seat behind one of the corners, surrounded by his family and a troop of boy scouts.

Stribling Enters Ring
Young Stribling was the first to climb through the ropes followed promptly by Jack Sharkey. The Bostonian shook hands with his opponent as he passed to cross the ring to the opposite corner.

James J. Corbett, formerly heavyweight champion of the world, climbed through the ropes to shake hands with both fighters.
Pa Stribling and Johnny Buckley, rival managers, examined the boxing gloves which were taken from brand new packages.

Paolino Challenges
Paolino Paolino then entered the ring with a challenge to the winner. There was an insistent demand for Jack Dempsey, and a tremendous clamor of applause arose when the ex-champion and promoter went into the ring to be introduced.

"I am happy to be here tonight and see the dream of my dear old pal, Tex Rickard, come true," said Dempsey, addressing the radio audience. The former champion was in high spirits at the success of his initial effort as a fight promoter.

Lou Magnolia of New York, the referee, skipped briskly into the ring and took up his place in a neutral corner. Sharkey's weight was announced as 192; Stribling's as 182. The odds just before the battle were 8 to 5 on the Bostonian.

FIGHT BY ROUNDS.
ROUND ONE—They met and sparred in the center of the ring. There was little damage done. Sharkey led with a left, Stribling lit in with a right to head, then hung on. Sharkey feinted twice with left and Stribling stepped in with right right to body. Sharkey was leading and Stribling hooked left to face. Sharkey jabbed left to face. Sharkey put right to head. Stribling jumped in again. Jack pumped rights to body. Stribling wrestled Sharkey to his knees. Jack was up without a count. They clinched. Stribling swung an overhead right, which bore Jack to ropes. Sharkey put a left to Stribling's head and hammered lefts to body as the bell rang. Sharkey's round.

ROUND TWO—Sharkey jumped in with left hook to head. Stribling held Jack in the corner, hammering hard rights to body. Stribling led lightly to face with left. Stribling beat Sharkey to a left jab to head. Stribling stepped in with a hard right to ribs. Sharkey put a left to body as Stribling retreated. The southerner hooked a light right to body, then clinched. Stribling jabbed left to face. Stribling was warned for butting as he held Sharkey on the ropes. Sharkey jabbed left to head and Stribling put hard right to head. Stribling's round.

ROUND THREE—Stribling jumped in again and missed with a left, then hung on. Sharkey drove low left to body. Stribling jabbed left to face, took left to head. Jack jabbed left to face. It is still a boxing match. Stribling hooked a right to body. Sharkey ripped hard uppercut to body. Stribling drove right to head. Sharkey jabbed left to head, drawing blood. Sharkey jabbed left to nose. Sharkey sent hard left to face. Sharkey missed, and Stribling went after him. Sharkey hooked a right to ribs and held. Stribling hooked a left. Sharkey's round.

ROUND FOUR—Sharkey jabbed. Stribling hooked low left to body. Sharkey hooked left to mouth and played to body with both hands. He was warned to keep them up. Jack jabbed left to face. Stribling danced. Sharkey jumped in with left hook to body. This time Stribling was warned for hitting low. They traded body punches and Stribling hooked a right to the ear on the ropes. Jack jabbed left to face. Stribling hooked a hard right to jaw, making Sharkey fight back savagely. Stribling whipped home a hard right to body then clinched. Stribling was short with a right to head. They clinched, and Magnolia broke them. Stribling's round.

ROUND FIVE—Sharkey drove hard right to body and followed with left to head. Sharkey drove both hands to body and brought them up to head without harm. Sharkey's seconds began to ride the referee. Stribling bleeding at mouth. Sharkey jabbed two lefts to head. Sharkey was the aggressor. Stribling backing away. Stribling stuck a left to Sharkey's body. Jack missed a left to head. Stribling brought up a

hard right to head, then missed with left. Stribling jabbed left to face. The Georgian hooked to body lightly. Sharkey kept chasing him but Stribling was well covered before stepping in with a left to body. Stribling sent hard right to jaw. They clinched. Stribling missed with a right. Sharkey uppercutting with both hands to the head. Round even.

ROUND SIX—Sharkey missed with both hands. Stribling hung on. Stribling sent left to body. Jack blocked a left lead to body and drove right to body himself. Stribling ran into a hard right uppercut as he jumped in. Sharkey kept left jabs in Stribling's face, and the Georgian did a little wrestling. Sharkey sent left jab to head. Sharkey just missed a hard right to body when Stribling went into a clinch. Stribling jabbed left to body, wrestling about the ring. Sharkey drove right to body. Stribling jumped into a clinch but Jack drove him off with rights and left to body.

Sharkey played for the body with both hands as Stribling swung right to head. The Georgian swung another right to head but took left to body just before the bell. Sharkey's round.

ROUND SEVEN—Sharkey was still the aggressor. He lanced lightly before a clinch. Jack jabbed and hooked a left to face. Stribling clinched. Sharkey ripped a left to Stribling's face. Stribling came back with a left to face. Stribling sent a low one to the waist and Stribling warned again to "keep them up." Stribling stepped in with both hands. Sharkey missed a right, but sent hard right uppercut to face. Sharkey was the aggressor still. He drove the Georgian back wards. Stribling hit after the referee told them to break. Stribling lit in with left to face. Sharkey right uppercut to body. The Georgian was bleeding from nose and mouth. Stribling reached in the clinches. They traded into another clinch in midring. Sharkey blocked a right aimed at his body as the bell rang. Sharkey's round.

ROUND EIGHT—Stribling jabbed left to face. He backed away as Jack stepped in with another left. They clinched. Both jabbed with lefts to head as they came out. Stribling lit home with a hard left to head. Sharkey waded in with a left to face. Stribling tied him up in another clinch. Stribling took the lead, fighting Sharkey into a corner. There was little damage done. They continued trading lefts. Stribling was again warned by the referee, who was booed by the crowd. Stribling drove Sharkey to the ropes with a left, but missed with a right at the bell. Round even.

ROUND NINE—Sharkey jabbed left to face. Stribling clinched without striking a blow. Sharkey was fast on feet but Stribling kept jumping into close quarters. Sharkey sent both hands in before Stribling clinched. Stribling swung hard right to jaw. Sharkey looked left to body and they traded rights to body. Stribling jabbed left to head then crossed a hard right to jaw. The crowd went wild. Stribling pounded a right to body before they clinched. Stribling was wild with lefts and Sharkey hooked hard left to face. Jack put light right to body. Stribling hooked left to Jack's body. Sharkey jabbed left, forcing Stribling to the corner. Stribling jumped into a clinch. Stribling hooked hard left to body. They traded light lefts before they clinched. Stribling's round.

ROUND TEN—They touched gloves coming out. Jack jabbed left to face. They traded light lefts. Stribling swung right to body. Sharkey put in hard left to mouth, drawing blood. Sharkey sent left to body, ducking a left hook. Sharkey was short with left uppercut. They clinched. Stribling's face was very bloody now. Stribling sent left to body. Stribling missed right to body. They clinched. Jack jabbed left to face. Stribling went in and hung on, Jack landing right to body. They traded lefts to face. Stribling hooked left in body before a clinch. Sharkey crossed hard right to jaw. Stribling hung on. Sharkey swung right to body, as Stribling led with a left. Jack played the body with both hands. Sharkey landed a right at the bell that ended the tenth round. Sharkey's round. Magnolia raised the Bostonian's hand.
