Antonia Tzantopoulos, alias Andrew Polus, charged with sodomy, will have his case brought before the grand jury.

Many Latency Cases

Joe Moran is charged with larceny; Frank Lusk is accused of an assault on a seven-year-old girl; Orville Jones, who took the blame for a minor partner also arrested, will have information on a charge of robbery filed against him with the jury.

A number of other cases of robbery and burglary will be presented. Frank Harvace, charged with burglary in a dwelling; Marquis Ortiz, accused of larceny; and Jason Charlie charged with burglary in a dwelling will have hearings.

One Still Case

B. C. Cooke, charged with possession of a still, will have the charges investigated by the seven men on the jury.

R. L. and Caroline S. McLean, charged with larceny by bailee, will be considered again by the grand jury. An indictment was returned in December and was subsequently dismissed by Judge A. L. Leavitt, on motion of the district attorney.

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION TO CONSTRUCT A SEWER IN PORTIONS OF HOT SPRINGS, HILLSIDE AND SECOND ADDITIONS, TO THE CITY OF KLAMATH FALLS, TO BE KNOWN AS SEWER UNIT NO. 12.

The City Engineer, pursuant to a resolution of the Common Council, heretofore adopted, having on the 11th day of February, 1929, filed his plans and specifications and estimates for the cost of installing and making what is known as the 12th Sewer Unit in portions of Hot Springs, Hillside and Second Additions, to the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, embracing in said unit all of the property hereinafter bounded and described, and the Council having taken the same under advisement and finding said plans, specifications and estimates satisfactory.

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, that the said plans, specifications and estimates for the construction and installing and making of what is known as the 12th Sewer Unit, be, and the same are hereby approved.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Common Council hereby declares its intention to construct and install the 12th Sewer Unit in accordance with the said plans, specifications and estimates; that said sewer unit shall be constructed by placing therein main pipes, vitrified sewer pipes, with Ys, manholes, lamp holes, and the like; or concrete sewer pipes made according to specifications for cement concrete sewer pipes, all as more fully shown on the said plans and specifications on file with the Police Judge, at a total estimated cost of twenty-nine thousand nine hundred sixty-three and 25/100 dollars (\$29,963.25) for vitrified pipes, and twenty-nine thousand nine hundred sixty-three and 25/100 dollars (\$29,963.25) for concrete pipes; said estimates in either event to include engineering supervision, advertising, clerical assistance and unforeseen contingencies.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by the Common Council that the property hereinafter described be, and is hereby declared to be benefited by the construction and installation of said sewer system to-wit: All of the property embraced within the following boundaries, to-wit:

Beginning at the most southerly corner of lot 5, block 22, Hot Springs Addition to the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon; thence northeasterly along the line between lots 5 and 6, said block 22, to and across Dolores avenue and along the line between lots 17 and 18, block 30, Hot Springs Addition; thence northeasterly to the most easterly point of lot 15, block 30, Hot Springs Addition; thence northeasterly along the center line of the northeast and southwest alley to the most southerly point of lot 5, block 22, Hot Springs Addition; thence southeasterly to the most southerly point of lot 5, block 30, Hot Springs Addition; thence northeasterly along the line between lots 5 and 6, said block 30, to the southwesterly line of Eldorado avenue; thence northeasterly along the southwesterly line of Eldorado, to the most easterly

corner of block 22, Hot Springs Addition; thence northeasterly along the northwesterly line of LeRoy street to the most easterly point of lot 22, block 22, Hot Springs Addition; thence northeasterly along the northwesterly line of said block 22, to and across Del Moro street to the most easterly corner of lot 22, block 18, Hillside Addition to the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon; thence northeasterly along the northwesterly line of Van Ness avenue; thence westerly along the southerly line of Van Ness avenue to the easterly line of the Central Pacific Railroad company right-of-way; thence southeasterly along said line to the point of beginning.

Said property above described shall be, and the same is hereby declared to be benefited and assessed for the expense of said sewer unit.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Monday, the 18th day of March, 1929, at the hour of 8 o'clock p.m. at the council chambers in the City Hall of Klamath Falls, Oregon, be fixed as the time and place for hearing objections or remonstrances against the construction and installation of said 12th Sewer Unit.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Police Judge be, and he is hereby authorized and directed, to cause notice of said hearing to be published as provided by the city charter.

The City Council reserves the right to reject any and all bids and to award contracts contingent upon the sale of the improvement bonds to cover the cost of said improvements.
