**Hindu Spiritualist Says
Need of World to
Be Happy**

LOS ANGELES, March 15. (U. P.)—What the world needs is more independent thought and less religion, Hindu spiritualist, said today when he arrived here enroute to his California home at Ojai, where he will hold his annual national star congress and camp in May.

"I am not here to establish a cult, but to lecture and teach and to create a new attitude of mind," he said.

"What the world wants, what you and I want as individuals is to be happy. To be happy, we must be free and to be free we must be free of desires. That is the perfume of life.

"There is already too much religion. Men and women must come to the position mentally, where they can view themselves and create changes in themselves before happiness can be attained."

SHERIFF SAYS 'SCABS' TABOO

**Will Not Protect Those
Who Work Where
Women Strike**

ELIZABETHTON, Tenn., March 15. (U. P.)—A sympathetic sheriff, who publicly denounced "scabs," was the hero of a thousand women strikers here tonight, as workers at the rayon plant of the American Giantstoff corporation continued their battle for higher wages.

Two thousand employees of the company, including 1,600 women, walked out early in the week, demanding a 25 per cent increase. Their wages before the strike ranged from \$8.50 to \$13 a week.

No acts of violence were reported during the day but both sides issued announcements of "victories" after the strike of Mexican generals. The company claimed workers were returning to their posts, while the strikers announced additions to their ranks.

J. M. Moreland, sheriff of Carter county, gave the strikers moral comfort when he declared "they deserve a raise in pay," and told corporation officials he would protect their property but would not protect "scabs."

Astoria Bank to Pay Dividend

ASTORIA, Ore., March 15. (U. P.)—Depositors of the Astoria National bank, which closed its doors in February, 1928, will receive their second dividend next Monday. It was announced today by receiver W. C. Crowley.

The dividend will be a 10 per cent one which means that approximately \$174,000 will be distributed. The bank has previously paid a 25 per cent dividend.

HOLLYWOOD, March 15. (U. P.)—Connie Talmadge, of the films, will be married to Townsend Natcher, wealthy Chicago merchant, on May 8. In the Hollywood home of her sister, Mrs. Natalie Keaton, it was announced that the marriage will be tonight.

The marriage will be Miss Talmadge's third venture. She formerly was the wife of John H. Hargrave, an importer, and captain Alastair Macintosh, an Englishman. Miss Talmadge obtained divorces in both instances.

Natcher's marriage to Gertrude Selby, actress, was terminated recently.

Only intimate friends of the family will attend the wedding at the home of Miss Talmadge's sister and brother-in-law, Buster Keaton, screen comedian.

Send Supplies

The office of Gov. Bird Graves at Montgomery reported tonight that National Guard officers in the Elba district had advised that rescue work was proceeding rapidly. Two negroes were the only fatalities reported to Governor Graves.

Supplies were being sent from Montgomery rapidly.

Fire Destroys Town

An unexpected disaster, coming as a tragic climax to the flood, was the almost total destruction of Castleberry, Ala., by fire, word of which was brought by a plane chartered by the Birmingham Post.

The pitiful sound of hundreds of women and children crying was heard by a telephone line-man who managed to make his way to within a half-mile of Elba today.

The flood water, which yesterday inundated Elba when the Pea river and Big creek overflowed their banks as a result of the heavy rains of the past several days, forced the entire population of the town, as well as outlying districts, to seek safety in office buildings and trees.

INDIAN GIRL HEADS TRIBE

**Will Makes 19-Year-Old
Maiden "Heap Big
Chief" Now**

KESHENA, Wis., March 15. (U. P.)—Indian lore that invested in the "braves" the duties of battle and of government, was relegated to the happy hunting ground today and sex equality became a fact in the Menominee tribe when a 19-year-old maiden known to her tribesmen as Princess Keshka, became the first female Indian chief.

The copper-skinned "true American" princess, whose real name is Alice Oshkosh, is 19 years old, and behind those 19 summers is a colorful section of Indian history.

The girl's great grandfather was the original Chief Oshkosh, and for that old warrior was named the city of Oshkosh, Wis.

The grandfather of the girl, Neopit Oshkosh, lived to know and love his granddaughter Alice and before he passed the crown of leadership to his son Ernest he filed papers and medals with the Indian bureau at Washington, providing that the girl could be ruler when Ernest died.

Death came to Ernest last week and today the girl's heritage was disclosed and recognized by the Indians.

Beatrice Lynch, Riddle's common law wife, was called to the stand for impeachment by M. O. Wilkins, defense attorney, but no point was gained. The girl had testified at the opening of the trial Tuesday.

Vernon George, Klamath Indian, declared she saw Riddle and Baker leave Beatty in Baker's car at 8 o'clock on the night of the murder. Marie Baker, the defendant's wife was also in the automobile, she said. Riddle had a gallon jug of moonshine with him. The witness testified, and had it covered with a blanket.

Later in the evening, she said, she saw Baker in a pool hall at Beatty with blood on his shirt. Baker informed her at the time that Riddle had left his car to visit some friends about three miles up the road from Beatty.

Find Hammer, Knife

Fred Hood, Shelby Lauer of Sprague River, and Anna May Copperfield all testified having seen Baker in the vicinity of Beatty on the night of the murder.

Watson Duffy, Indian officer, found the automobile hammer Baker is alleged to have killed Riddle with, the knife Riddle had borrowed from Gilbert Copperfield and a large spot of blood on December 8, when he conducted a searching party for Riddle.
