

FOUR NATIONAL LEAGUE CLUBS' LINE-UPS MADE

Four Managers Remain Who Are Undecided On Changes

NEW YORK, March 27. (UP)—Four National League managers practically have settled on the lineups of their clubs, while the other four still are experimenting with various combinations.

No further changes are planned in the lineups of the Chicago Cubs, the New York Giants, St. Louis Cardinals and Philadelphia Phillies. On the other hand, the lineups of the Pittsburgh Pirates, Cincinnati Reds, Brooklyn Robins and Boston Braves remain uncertain.

Horsby New Cub
Rogers Horsby, National League batting champion, is the only new figure, outside the pitcher's box, in the ranks of the Cubs.

Only minor changes have been made in the Giants. Andy Reese temporarily has won the second base job from Andy Cohen. Fred Lusch, obtained from the Philadelphia Phillies in a trade for Lefty O'Doul, has the call for left field. Art Veltmann, speedy Texan, possibly will win an alternate outfield berth.

Southworth to Play
New faces will be seen at shortstop, third base and possibly in right field in the Cardinals' lineup. Charlie Gelbert, Rochester Flash, apparently will hold down the shortstop job. Fred Haney, former Detroit infielder, is slated to play third base, leaving Frankie Frisch at second base. Manager Billy Southworth or Wally Reuther, who broke his leg early last season, will play right field.

The Philadelphia Phillies probably have been strengthened by the addition of Tommy Thresh, who has regained his 1926 form, at shortstop. Lefty O'Doul in left field and Homer Peel, Houston recruit, in center field.

Bush Undecided
Donie Bush has been confronted by numerous handicaps in selecting the Pirates' lineup, and other changes may be made before the season opens April 18. Earl Sherry, former Chicago White Sox first baseman, has made good at the initial sack and Adam Comorosky probably will play regularly in the outfield this season.

Third base has been giving Jack Hendricks, manager of the Reds, the most trouble, but Clark Pittinger, who filled the role of utility infielder last year, probably will start the season at the hot corner. Evar Swanson, a Pacific Coast League star, apparently is headed for a regular outfield job.

Braves Change
With Glenn Wright's arm still an uncertain quantity and Jack Flowers, last year's regular second baseman, on the sick list, Manager Wilbert Robinson is having a great deal of difficulty in selecting his infield. Bill Rhief from Atlanta and Max Rosenfield, who came up from Birmingham as an outfielder, may break into the infield.

HORTON SMITH WINS TOURNAMENT

PINEBURST, N. C., March 27. (UP)—Horton Smith, the golfing marvel from Joplin, Mo., once more confounded the law of averages and a large field of excellent players today when he forced to the front in the 27th annual North and South Open Tournament and came on to win another triumph with a score of 287.

Two strokes behind Smith was Tommy Armour, Detroit, who finished second with 289. The young Missouri professional wrestled the lead from George Fehlig, North and South amateur champion, when he played today's first 18 holes in 67 strokes, five under par, to give him a score of 211 for 54 holes. This placed him four strokes ahead of the Washington amateur, who, leading the pack up to that point, stood second with 215.

Easing up after this remarkable exhibition, the young golfing marvel played the final 11 holes this afternoon in nine strokes more than he required this morning, shooting a 76 for his total of 287 strokes for the 72 holes.

As many as half a dozen changes may be noted in the Boston Braves when they take the field April 16. Freddy McGuire, formerly of the Cubs, will be at second. Rabbit Maranville or R. J. James, Omaha rookie, will be at shortstop. Joe Dugan is competing with Lester Bell for third base.

LOUGHRAN TO MEET WALKER

Mickey Has Chance For Third Title in Go Tonight

CHICAGO, March 27. (UP)—Mickey Walker, the middleweight bulldog, who aspires to annex his third fight crown, and Tommy Loughran, light heavyweight title holder, completed training today for their 10-round bout which will feature the opening of Chicago's new Stadium tomorrow night.

The largest indoor crowd in history is expected to attend the show.

Walker believes he will win by a knockout. Tommy thinks he can use his left hand well enough to stave off the bulldog's tactics of Mickey, and then do enough right-crossing to retain his title.

Mickey goes into the ring with a chance at an honor previously held by only one man—Bob Fitzsimmons. If he wins, Walker will become a three titleholder.

Walker, once a welterweight champion, is the present holder of the middleweight crown. Fitzsimmons held the middleweight, light heavyweight, and heavyweight titles.
