BRAYS OUTSLUG ROBINS

Few Fish Seen in Klamath Streams, Water Deep, Swift

With the opening of the fishing season only about two weeks away, Klamath anglers may find the customary fishing streams too deep for good sport, a survey of the streams around Fort Klamath showed yesterday.

The waters of Fort Creek, Crooked creek and Seven-Mile creek were swift and crystal clear. The clearness of the water precluded good fishing, but few fish were seen. It is possible that before the season starts the snows in the mountains will be sufficiently melted to carry sediment into the streams.

Although the fish have been plentiful about the base of the Williamson river dam at Chiloquin, most of them had evidently given up hopes of leaping the barrier, for none were being caught by the Indians yesterday. Trout have been pulled out of the river at this point by the backfall.

An attempt was made by a party of motorists to make the trip entirely along Upper Klamath lake, this including some of the streams on the west side of the survey, but deep snowdrifts halted the car several miles east of Cherry creek. The mountain road was found covered with several inches of snow in most places, which was melting fast, however. It is believed that cars will be able to get around the lake by the opening of the season.
