**KID CHOCOLATE WINS ON FOUL**  
Wants to Finish Fight But Referee Stops Bout in Seventh

NEW YORK, April 12 (U. P.)—Kid Chocolate's fight with Graham of Eliza, N. Y., after 11 rounds, a seconds' fight in the seventh round of a scheduled 15-round bout before 15,000 persons at the opening of the New York coliseum here tonight.

The bout, which was scheduled as a best-of-seven championship fight, was stopped by the referee in the seventh round when Graham refused to come in at the 115-pound limit. Hearing Chocolate will no longer of doing so.

to Mrs. Campbell's wife about it. "I don't think I'll ever know. He won't help himself. He doesn't care."

Despite her tear-streaked face and her nervousness, Mrs. Campbell, a well-preserved woman, still carried traces of the earlier beauty which had attracted the murderer. He had married her at a time when he had not yet obtained a legal dissolution of a previous marriage. Of that story Mrs. Campbell did not care to talk.

**Jekyll-Hyde Existence**

Detectives based themselves with a systematic search of the apartment, looking in Campbell's desk for papers, searching his letter files. What they found was more than a picture of the Jekyll-Hyde existence his confession had revealed, but also an eccentric, esoteric personality that defied their understanding.

They found this imperishable photo of a man a letter of strange date. In his room which was strewn everywhere. A strong box he owned was found open, and it was crammed with cash.

**"Lonely Heart" Writer**

They found that he was a prolific correspondent of matrimonial agencies and of the "lonely heart" columns of newspapers. For years, apparently, he had been leading a secret matrimonial life, working to enable women with money through this channel just as his confession will be had, ending Mrs. Morry.

Prosecutor Bergen of Sonoma county was closed all day with Campbell, but revealed little of what the engineer had told him during the questioning, beyond the fact that his confession was complete, and left no doubt in the minds of authorities that he was the murderer.

The identity of the charged body found in a marshy area near Oakland, N. J., on February 22, had remained a mystery until a few days ago, when friends of Mrs. Morry came from Greenville, Pa., and identified the remains. They recalled that she had left Greenville to marry a "Dr. Richard M. Campbell of Baltimore." It was a way, which he did not reveal, Police Chief Hennessey continued the name "Richard Campbell" and real estate bought in Baltimore with the purchase of a \$15,000 house last year in Westfield, N.
