RESOLUTION OF INTENTION

SCHOOL STREET FROM THE NORTHEASTERLY LINE OF NORTH 5TH STREET TO THE SOUTHWESTERLY LINE OF NORTH 6TH STREET; LINCOLN STREET FROM THE NORTHEASTERLY LINE OF NORTH 6TH STREET TO THE NORTHWESTERLY LINE OF NORTH 8TH STREET, TO BE KNOWN AS IMPROVEMENT UNIT NO. 12.

The City Engineer, pursuant to a resolution of the Common Council heretofore adopted, having on the 1st day of April, 1929, filed plans, specifications and estimates for the cost of improving School street from the north-easterly line of North 5th street to the southwesterly line of North 6th street; Lincoln street from the north-easterly line of North 6th street to the northwesterly line of North 8th street; including in said improvement storm sewers as hereinafter more particularly described, said improvement unit to be known as Improvement Unit No. 12, and the council having taken the same under advisement and finding said plans, specifications and estimates satisfactory.

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, that the said plans, specifications, and estimates for the improvement of said portions of said streets, being the plans, specifications and estimates filed herein on the 1st day of April, 1929, be and the same are hereby approved, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Common Council hereby declares its intention to improve said portions of said streets in accordance with said plans, specifications and estimates. Said improvement to consist more particularly of paving and improving said portions of said street as follows:

This project consists in paving School street from the north-easterly line of North 5th street to the southwesterly line of North 6th street; Lincoln street from the north-easterly line of North 6th street to the northwesterly line of North 8th street, with cement concrete pavement type "C" or Warrentite bitulithic pavement type "D", or asphaltic concrete pavement type "D".

School street is to be paved twenty-one (21) feet in width, together with concrete curbs and with a parking strip and a four (4) foot cement concrete sidewalk on the northwesterly side of the street.

Lincoln street is to be paved twenty-six (26) feet in width with cement concrete curbs and five (5) foot sidewalks on both sides of the street.

Sanitary sewer house connections will be constructed from the center of the street to the property line and necessary storm sewers will be constructed to take care of surface drainage.

The estimated cost of all classes of improvement, embracing all work and material for the complete improvement of said

project, for each type of said pavement being as follows: Cement concrete pavement type "C" \$17,055.20; vibrolithic cement concrete pavement type "C" \$17,397.41; Warrentite bitulithic pavement type "D" \$16,974.90; asphaltic concrete pavement type "D" \$16,974.90; said estimates in either event to include engineering supervision, advertising, clerical assistance, and unforeseen contingencies. Said estimates in either event to include installation of storm sewer system for said district to the extent necessary to prevent further cutting of the pavement and to provide as appears necessary to the extent as appears necessary to be built along said streets sufficient to care for the needs of the property abutting upon said streets. Said improvement to also include a valley gutter, all as more fully shown in detail on the said plans, specifications and estimates on file with the Police Judge of said city.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Common Council, that a storm sewer system shall be installed as a part of said improvement to the extent necessary to avoid further cutting into the pavement and to extent necessary to care for the surface water from the property in said unit. Provision for storm sewer pipes and catch basins is to be made at the necessary points and to insure drainage of the streets, all as more fully shown upon the plans and specifications, to which reference is hereby made.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Common Council that the

properties lying within the boundaries hereinafter described be, and the same to hereby declared to be benefited, to-wit:

Beginning at the most northerly corner of lot 1, block 64, Nichols Addition to the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon; thence southeasterly along the southwesterly line of North 6th street to the most easterly corner of lot 3, block 54, of said addition; thence southeasterly through the center of said block 54 to and across North 7th street and through the center of block 44, First Addition to the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, to the northwesterly line of North 6th street; thence southeasterly along the northwesterly line of North 6th street to the most southerly point of lot 2, block 45, First Addition; thence southeasterly across North 6th street to a point on the southwesterly line of North 6th street, which is 110 feet southeasterly from the south-easterly line of School street; thence southeasterly across block 51, First Addition, and parallel to the southwesterly line of North 5th street; thence northwesterly along the northwesterly line of North 5th street to the southeasterly line of Jefferson street; thence northwesterly along the northwesterly line of North 6th street to the center line of the alley in block 35, First Addition; thence northeast-

erly parallel to Lincoln street to the point of beginning.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all of the aforesaid property included in the boundaries above described be, and the same to hereby declared to be benefited and assessed for the expense of said improvement and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Monday, the 6th day of May, 1929, at the hour of 8 o'clock, p.m., at the council chambers in the City Hall of Klamath Falls, Oregon, be fixed as the time and place for the hearing of objections and remonstrances against said property improvement; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Police Judge be, and he is hereby directed, to cause copies of such hearing to be published as provided by the city charter of the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon.
