GENARO TAKES TITLE ON FOUL

Pladner Has Best of Bout Until One Low Blow Hits American

PARIS, April 18 (AP)—Frankie Genaro, New York bantam and former flyweight champion, won on a foul from Smiley (Spider) Pladner of France, European champion, in the fifth round of a 15-round bout advertised for the world's 112-pound title here tonight.

When they met March 2, Pladner knocked out Genaro in the first round. Genaro claimed foul, but his protest was disallowed. The crowd was in an uproar over the violent tactics used by Genaro in the first four rounds. The spectators had hissed the American throughout for hitting with his head, and the judges twice warned him for such tactics.

Genaro was on the floor twice in the fifth round. The first time he was down for nine and the second for the full ten seconds, which would have resulted in a knock out for Pladner had not the Frenchman been disqualified for a low blow.

Of the first four rounds, Genaro won two, Pladner one with the other even. Pladner was dominating the fifth when the disqualification came.

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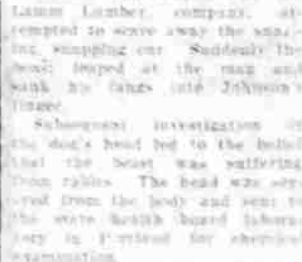

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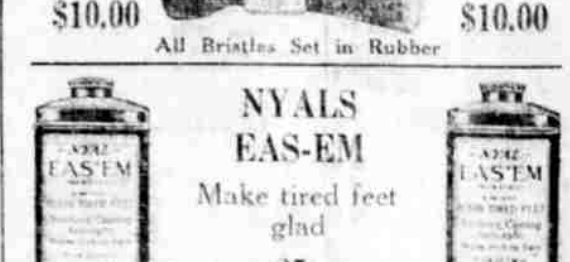
