RESOLUTION OF INTENTION

A RESOLUTION TO IMPROVE PACIFIC TERRACE FROM DEL MORO STREET TO VAN NESS AVENUE; DEL MORO STREET FROM EL DORADO AVENUE TO PACIFIC TERRACE; LE ROY STREET FROM EL DORADO AVENUE TO PACIFIC TERRACE; EL DORADO AVENUE FROM FREMONT STREET TO DEL MORO STREET; TO BE KNOWN AS IMPROVEMENT UNIT NO. 82.

The City Engineer, pursuant to a resolution of the Common Council heretofore adopted, having on the 15th day of April, 1929, filed plans, specifications, and estimates for the cost of improving Pacific Terrace from Del Moro street to Van Ness avenue; Del Moro street from El Dorado avenue to Pacific Terrace; Le Roy street from El Dorado avenue to Pacific Terrace; El Dorado avenue from Fremont to Del Moro street; to be known as improvement Unit No. 82, and the council having taken the same under advisement and finding said plans, specifications and estimates satisfactory.

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, that the said plans, specifications and estimates for the improvement of said portions of said streets, being the plans, specifications and estimates filed herewith on the 15th day of April, 1929, be and the same are hereby approved; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Common Council hereby declare its intention to improve said portions of said streets in accordance with said plans, specifications and estimates. Said improvement to consist more particularly of paving and improving said portions of said streets as follows:

This project consists of paving Pacific Terrace from the northwesterly line of Del Moro street to the southeasterly line of Van Ness avenue, with type "B" cement concrete pavement; or vibrolithic method type "B"; or type "E" bituminous concrete pavement. The pavement is to be laid in two strips sixteen feet wide with a parking strip in the center. Also of paving El Dorado avenue from the northwesterly line of Fremont street to the northwesterly line of Del Moro street; Le Roy street and Del Moro street, each from the southeasterly line of Pacific Terrace to the northwesterly line of El Dorado avenue, with type "B" cement concrete pavement; or the vibrolithic method; or type "E" bituminous concrete pavement, twenty-six feet in width. Sidewalks five feet in width are to be constructed on each side of each street improved.

Storm sewers are to be constructed where necessary to properly take care of the surface water.

The estimated cost of all classes of improvement, embracing all work and material for the complete improvement of said project, for each type of said pavement being as follows:

Cement concrete pavement, types "B" and "B-2" \$46.408.78; vibrolithic pavement types "B" and "B-2" \$47.992.78; Warrenite bitulithic types "E" and "E-2" \$46.977.90; asphaltic concrete pavement types "E" and "E-2" \$46.977.90, said estimates in either event to include engineering supervision, advertising, clerical

assistance, and unforeseen contingencies. Said estimates to also include, round bar reinforcement, catch basins, curbs and gutters.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by the Common Council that the property lying within the boundaries hereinafter described, be, and the same is hereby declared to be benefited, to-wit:

Beginning at the most southerly corner of lot 23, block 21, Hot Springs Addition to the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon; thence northwesterly along the line between lots 21 and 22, 9 and 10, block 21, of said addition, to and across Le Roy street and along the line between lots 21 and 22, 9 and 10, block 22, of said addition, to and across Del Moro street and along the line between lots 21 and 22 to the center of the northeast and southwest alley of block 19, Hillside Addition to the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon; thence northwesterly along the centerline of said alley and along the line between lots 2 and 4, block 19, of said addition to and across Painter street, and along the line between lots 14 and 15, block 18 of said addition, to a line drawn through the center of lot 9, parallel to El Dorado avenue, extended, of block 18, of said addition; thence northwesterly along the center of lot 9, block 18, of said addition to and across Painter street, and along the center line of lots 20 and 9, block 13 of said addition to and across Lawrence street and along

the center of lots 20 and 9, of block 8, of said addition to and across Lowell street and along the center of lot 4, block 5, of said addition to the southerly line of Van Ness avenue; thence easterly along the southerly line of Van Ness avenue in the northwesterly city limits; thence southeasterly along the line of the northwesterly city limits to the northwesterly line of Del Moro street; thence southwesterly along the northwesterly line of Del Moro street to the southwesterly line of Pacific Terrace; thence southeasterly along the southwesterly line of Pacific Terrace to the line between lots 3 and 4, block 34, Hot Springs Addition; thence southeasterly along the line between lots 3 and 4, block 34, of said addition to a line through the center of lot 26 extended parallel to Pacific Terrace; thence southeasterly along the centerline of lot 20, block 24, of said addition to the northwesterly line of Fremont street; thence southwesterly along the northwesterly line of Fremont street to the point of beginning.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all of the aforesaid property included in the boundaries above described, be, and the same is hereby declared to be benefited and assessed for the expense of said improvement; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Monday, the 20th day of May, 1929, at the hour of 3 o'clock, p.m. at the council chambers in the city hall of Klamath Falls, Oregon, be fixed

as the time and place for the hearing of objections and remonstrances against said property improvement; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Police Judge, he, and he is hereby directed to cause notice of such hearing to be published as provided by the city charter of the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon.
