REPORT GIVEN ON CONDITIONS OF PARK ROADS

Two Feet of Snow Covers
Park; Beetle Camps
in Operation

There is an average of two feet of snow all over Crater Lake park at the present time, according to a telephone message received at the chamber of commerce yesterday afternoon from Chief Forester Godfrey.

Godfrey stated that it is impossible to get to Anna Springs at the present time by car and all supplies for the beetle camps are being hauled in from the south entrance with a caterpillar tractor.

Motorists can get within a quarter of a mile of the west entrance at the present time and can get a short distance inside the south entrance. It is believed they can get to Anna Springs from the south entrance by June 1, and will be able to motor as far as White Horse from the western entrance by that date.

Steel at Springs
The force of men now employed in the park is engaged in beetle control work, Godfrey said. There is no effort being made to clear the road through the snow. There are two camps established for the control work, one at Anna Springs and the other at Munson Valley.

Judge Will Steel, former superintendent of Crater Lake park, and now a park commissioner, is at Anna Springs where he will remain all summer, Godfrey stated in the telephone conversation.

To Open July 1
The tourist season in the park will officially open July 1, and the cafeteria store and camp ground will be in operation by July 20. The clean-up crew will be taken in to the lodge June 20 and the remainder of the employees will take up their duties June 28.

On the opening day a new 40-passenger launch will be delivered to the east side of the lake and put in operation for the fourth of July.

About 50 per cent of the employees of the lodge last year will be on duty again this year. It has been learned, and nearly all the boys and girls engaged to work in the dining room, news stand, store, boats, and cafeteria are students of the University of Oregon and Oregon State college.

14 White People Die of Malaria

LONDON, May 23. (U. P.)—Fourteen Europeans out of the total white population of 70 men and three women at Komatiport in Mozambique (Portuguese East Africa) have died of malaria and black water fever, the Johannesburg correspondent of the Daily Telegraph reported tonight.

Practically every inhabitant of the town, which is on the frontier, was stricken, the dispatch said.

RESERVATION BEETLE LOSS SHOWS DECLINE

Control Crews Cover Over
36,000 Acres in War
On Pests

KLAMATH AGENCY, Ore., May 23 (Special)—Beetle destruction in the pine timber on the Indian reservation has declined from 10 to 50 per cent this season, declared R. H. Birney, in charge of the bug work at the reservation, yesterday.

This decline is due to the presence of plenty of moisture and generally favorable weather conditions, continued Mr. Birney. The splendid work of government control workers is also responsible for part of the let-down in the pestilence, it must be inferred.

During the current fiscal year ending June 1, the government budgeted \$25,000 to be used to overcome the beetle attack and a similar amount will be available for another season, the forestry man said.

Treat 7,000 Trees
Bug crews are operating in the Black hills, situated in the southeastern part of the reservation. Two camps of 70 men each are maintained, but next season the crews will be decreased to 40 men in each camp.

In beetle fighting the work is done so thoroughly as to include 100 per cent of infected trees. So far 7,000 places have been treated this year.

An infected tree is cut down and the bark is burned, which also consumes the larva. This is a sure method of curtailing the activities of the most voracious beetle colony.

The day's program of the beetle crew calls for spotting each tree in an infected section. Sick pines are blazed, numbered and noted on maps.

Examine 20,000 Acres
Then come the bug surgeons with their axes and saws and the offending member is hewn down and cast into the fire.

Thirty-six thousand acres of trees were examined last year and it was found that from 50 to 60 trees were infected in each section. The maximum of infection was 250 trees to the section.

So numerous are the beetle worms in some trees that when the bark is removed the larva falls out on the ground like rice. Woodpeckers place beetle worms at the top of the list in their bill of fare and are aiding in destroying the pests.

Mississippi Is Near Overflow Disaster Mark

MEMPHIS, Tenn., May 23. (U. P.)—Sections of the levee at Mounds Landing, Miss., were crumbling into the swollen Mississippi river tonight while 500 men attempted to hold back the waters.

The river still was rising slowly, with a stage of 51.5 feet at Greenville. National guardsmen were ready to mobilize quickly if needed, and Red Cross officials had laid plans for relief work. Gov. Theodore G. Bilbo of Mississippi wired Major General Richmond P. Davis an appeal for aid.

"A break in the Mounds Landing levee is probable within a day or two," he said, "and if this occurs there will be a repetition of the 1927 overflow."

Tents and blankets were requested by the governor for families already driven from their homes by backwaters in Issaquena and Sharkey counties, 75 per cent of which are under water.



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
