Mr. Castel reported that it was snowing at Fort Klamath, and that the winter sports which ski club members had planned for Sunday will be impossible.

Mr. Castel also reported that he had received word from Caretaker Ralph at Crater Lake lodge that snow was falling at the lake and a strong gale blowing, making it impossible for cars to reach the rim.

A caravan of the ski club members planned to leave early on New Year's morning for the lake rim, to participate in skiing and jumping events.

"As for the annual ski races to be held here in February, we are making all kinds of plans. Since February 22nd is on Sunday, we expect a larger crowd than ever, and may even extend the celebration into a two-day event," he stated.
