PLAN BRIDGE DEDICATION

Grants Pass Span Will Be Dedicated May 23 on Rogue River

Linking the Pacific Northwest closer with the Redwood Empire and San Francisco, the new Grants Pass bridge, spanning the Rogue river, will be dedicated with a coast-wide celebration Saturday, May 23.

Participating in the dedicatory ceremonies will be the Grants Pass chamber of commerce, the Oregon Cavesmen, Inc., the Oregon Highway commission, the Josephine County court, the U. S. Bureau of Roads and the Redwood Empire association.

High federal and state officials, officials of British Columbia, city and county officials of all Pacific Coast states and chamber of commerce leaders from all parts of the coast will be among the guests at the bridge fete.

A unique feature of the affair will be a ceremony, conducted by the Oregon Cavesmen similar to the ancient Druid ritual. This will take place in the evening at the famous Oregon Caves national monument.

The Grants Pass bridge is the third of a kind to be built in the United States. It was designed by C. B. McCullough, Oregon state highway bridge engineer, along lines originated by a famous French bridge designer.

Nature has provided a beautiful scenic setting for the span, which will be enhanced with a series of powerful floodlights under the bridge deck, illuminating the river on both sides for more than a quarter of a mile.
