Twenty Grand Captures the 57th Kentucky Derby

SWEEP ALL SECOND AND MATE THIRD

Thoroughbred Shows Great Heart in Fast Finish on Fine Day

CHURCHILL DOWNS, Louisville, Ky., May 16. (UP)—Out of the middle of the Kentucky derby field, Twenty Grand came pounding down the stretch to capture the 57th running of America's most picturesque horse race today in the record-smashing time of two minutes, 14-5/16 seconds.

The Green Stable's Bay Colt, beaten by Mate in the pre-kness, came back today to turn the tables on his conqueror and run the fastest mile and a quarter derby in all history. The former record was 2:03 2-5 made by Old Rosebud in 1914. Twenty Grand's time also set a new Churchill Downs track record for the distance.

A crowd of 60,000 saw Jockey Kurtsinger, a little blonde Louisville boy, astride Twenty Grand, out-ride a field of 11 other three-year-olds.

In second place, four lengths behind Twenty Grand came the Dallas Farm's Sweep All. A. C. Bostwick's Mate, the Pre-kness winner and second choice to the Green Stable entry today, finished third.

Twenty Grand paid \$2.70 to win; \$3.00 to place, and \$2.60 to show. Sweep All paid \$15.55 to place and \$7.16 to show. Mate paid \$3.62 to show.

WORTH \$48,725
Coupled with his two stable mates, Anchors Aweigh and Sari Board, in the Matel betting, Twenty Grand paid only \$2.76 to win, \$3.00 to place and \$2.00 to show. Paying less than even money, Twenty Grand was one of the shortest price derby winners of all time. It has been 16 years since a derby winner paid less than even money, Old Rosebud being the last odds-on favorite when he paid only 4-5 in 1914.

Sweep All paid \$15.55 to place and \$7.16 to show. Mate paid \$3.62 to show.

The victory was worth \$48,725 to Mrs. Payne Whitney, owner of the Green Stable, \$6,000 to Charles T. Finner, owner of Sweep All, \$3,000 to A. C. Bostwick, owner of Mate, and \$1,000 to C. H. Kaebeke and Charles Morris, owners of Spanish Play, which finished fourth.

CURTIS PRESENTS CUP
Shortly after Twenty Grand paraded back to the stewards stand, Vice-President Chase, Curtis, guest of honor, presented the \$5,000 gold cup, emblematic of victory in the derby, to Trainer James Rowe.

As Twenty Grand came in front of the clubhouse, Jockey Kurtsinger patted the neck of St. Germain-Bonus on the neck. The crowd swarmed around Twenty Grand as Trainer Rowe was presented with the giant floral horseshoe and gave a great ovation to the game thoroughbred who placed his name alongside of Old Rosebud, Exterminator, Bubbling Over, Gallant Fox and other derby immortals.

NERVOUS WINNER
The floral horseshoe, usually placed around the neck of the derby winner, was given to Trainer Rowe, because Twenty Grand was too nervous to stand still. Before the race he was calm, making no trouble at all going to the post or in the starting gate.

It was a perfect racing day, and the ideal weather conditions and fast track produced one of the smoothest derbies in years. In contrast to the wretched weather of the last four years, when rain and mud combined to spoil thousands of dollars worth of feminine finery, the sun was as low as the field paraded to the post.

STARTS BACK
When the cry, "They're Off," thundered from the back of the stands, Twenty Grand and Mate, the two favorites, were back in the field and they remained there as they came thundering down the first quarter mile in front of the stands.

Joseph Leiter's gray gelding, Prince D'Amour, a 50-1 shot in the betting, rushed to the front, followed by H. C. Hatch's Boys Howdy, fourth choice, and Sweep All. They rounded the first turn in that order, with Twenty Grand moving up in the middle of the

field and Mate trailing in the rear with a couple of other horses.

The gray, Prince D'Amour passed the half mile post in front, a nose ahead of Boys Howdy, in turn a nose ahead of Sweep All.

CHANGE PLACES
At this point, Sari Board, stablemate of Twenty Grand, who had been expected to set the early pace, was back in the rear with the other Green Stable entry, Anchors Aweigh.

As they raced down the back stretch, Sweep All, ridden by Frank Collett of New Orleans, flashed to the front. Boys Howdy and Prince D'Amour found the going too fast for them, and faded fast.

Coming on with a burst of speed, Walter J. Salmon's Ladder, third in the Pre-kness, moved up just behind the leader, Sweep All. The two, Sweep All and Ladder, were a couple of lengths out in front of the next group, headed by Mate, who had driven up to a challenging position from about seventh place.

FINISHES FAST
Going into the last turn on the back side, the leaders were Sweep All, Ladder, Mate, Boys Howdy and Twenty Grand in the order named.

Around the last bend, Twenty Grand started his drive. The big bay colt's flashing legs began to cut the distance separating him from the leaders, and as the field

rounded the final turn and swung wide into the home stretch, there was Twenty Grand up among the leaders.

The crowd, with thousands of dollars riding on the Green Stable entry, roared:

"Twenty Grand's Coming!"

SHOWS GREAT HEART
And come he did, with the speed of a sprinter and the heart of a thoroughbred. After the turn, Twenty Grand quickly forged to the front, moved on close to the rail and began to spread-eagle the field.

As they entered and came down the stretch, Twenty Grand was out in front and going away. He had the race all to himself as Jockey Kurtsinger, nicknamed "The Flying Dutchman," moved Twenty Grand over to the rail and rode him out, one of the most decisive derby winners in history.

Kurtsinger never had to put the whip to Twenty Grand. The little Kentucky boy, born and reared in Louisville, had learned from the days when he peeped over the railing as a kid to watch derbies of other days, that thoroughbreds will run without putting the bat to them. All he had to do was sit there and ride. Twenty Grand did the rest.

GIANTS BEAT CARDS, NEAR FIRST PLACE

Athletics Increase Lead To Game and Half, Senators Win

NEW YORK, May 16. (UP)—The New York Giants advanced to within a half a game of the National league leadership today when they defeated the first-place St. Louis Cardinals, 7 to 6.

Strong relief pitching by John Barry, who relieved Carl Henry after the Cardinals had scored five runs in the first three innings, gave the Giants victory. Rallies in the sixth and seventh innings, featured by home runs by Ott and Hogan, brought about Flint Rhem's downfall.

BRAYES KEEP PACE
The Boston Braves kept pace with the Giants and advanced to within a game of St. Louis by defeating Pittsburgh, 9 to 2. Tom Zachary held the Pirates to five scattered hits while Kremer, starting Pittsburgh hurler, was knocked from the mound in the seventh after he had allowed 12 hits.

Brooklyn defeated Cincinnati, 2 to 1, and moved up into a tie with Philadelphia for sixth place. Dazzy Vance outpitched Carl Hubbell, who struck out seven Reds. Rube Bressler's long fly, scoring Frederick, who had tripled, brought in the winning run in the ninth inning.

CUBS BREAK EVEN
Chicago broke even in a double header with the Phillies, losing the first contest 5 to 1 and winning the second, 17 to 6. The Phillies made all of their eight hits in the first game while Dudley scattered the 12 blows he allowed the Cubs. In the second contest the Cubs pounded out 20 hits and were never in danger.

The Philadelphia Athletics increased their leadership in the American league to a game and a half by defeating the Cleveland Indians, 12 to 5. It was Cleveland's eighth consecutive defeat. The Indians piled up an early lead but Grove hurled effectively in the late innings as the Athletics bombarded five hurriers for 20 hits.

SENATORS SECOND
Washington moved into second place by whipping St. Louis 9 to 7 while the New York Yankees were losing to Detroit, 3 to 1.

Joe Cronin's triple in the 11th inning gave the Senators victory. Washington came from behind to tie the score by knocking Collins out of the box and continuing their assault on Coffman.

The New York-Detroit game was called in the sixth inning because of rain. Bridges held the Yankees to three hits while the Tigers made the most of their five blows off Johnson.

The Chicago White Sox defeated Boston, 3 to 0, and ended their seven game losing streak. Pat Caraway held the Red Sox to four scattered hits.

ENTRIES FOR WESTERN GOLF MEET LIMITED

PORTLAND, Ore., May 16 (UP)—Entries in the western golf association championship tournament will be limited to 200 players, according to a decision reached by the tournament committee of the Portland golf club.

It also has been decided that the medal play rounds in the championship will start at 7:30 o'clock Monday morning, July 13.

The limitation placed on the number of entries means that a full field will not be off in that event and that the eligibility committee might have to do some pruning in order to cut the field to that number.

Indications point to one of the greatest fields in the history of the association participating in the tournament. There is a possibility that Cyril Tolley, the famous English player, will be among the contenders. "Chick" Evans, who has won the title eight times, also may be listed among the starters.

New Speedboat Record Claimed Unofficially
CARDONE, Italy, May 16. (UP)—A new unofficial speedboat record was claimed today by Kaye Don, British racing driver, in the Miss England II.

Don, it was revealed today, made 170 kilometers an hour in a trial run last night, or 105.57 miles an hour, bettering his record of 103.4 miles made in Ardena recently.

Don made several official trials today but failed to reach a record speed. He quit for the day when the propeller shaft of his boat became overheated.

Before his trial run last night Gabriel D'Annunzio, famed poet, inspected the speedboat and told Don he had given it his wheel his "mystic touch."

"If you do not break a record," D'Annunzio said solemnly, "I shall die."

Columbia Crew Beats M.I.T. on Harlem River
NEW YORK, May 16 (UP)—Stroked by the redoubtable Sykes McKel, Columbia's undefeated varsity crew, swept to its third successive victory of the season on the Harlem river today, defeating Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

The Blue and White oarsmen crossed the finish line two lengths in front in 7:30. M. I. T.'s time was 7:36.

M. I. T. set a fast pace at the start and it was not until the mile mark was passed that Columbia, rowing smoothly and with little effort, drew alongside. They matched strokes until just before the mile and a quarter, when Columbia moved a quarter length in front.

The Lions then raised their beat to 38 and began moving away. M. I. T. answered the challenge but it was to no avail for Columbia hit the mile and a half marker an even length in front and increased its advantage with every stroke.

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WEST COAST THREATENS TO TAKE MEET

LOS ANGELES, May 16. (UP)—The West Coast gave warning of an impending cleanup in the National Intercollegiate A. A. A. meet at Philadelphia two weeks hence, when the University of Southern California and Stanford University track teams staged a record-breaking duel in the coliseum here this afternoon.

Billed as the California Intercollegiate Meet, the affair arose developed into a runaway for the Trojans, with Stanford safely in second place and University of California and California at Los Angeles fighting for odd points.

Ten meet records were broken during the afternoon and one world's record was equalled.

University of Southern California won with 93 points, leading Stanford by 44 points. Stanford made 49 points; University of California 19 and U. C. L. A. 2.

The flying feet of Frank Wykoff, holder of the unofficial world's record of 9 4-10 seconds in the hundred-yard dash, carried him to a double victory in the sprints. Wykoff equalled the recognized record of 9 5-10 seconds, held by Eddie Tolan of Michigan, in the Century, to defeat Hee Dyer of Stanford by a yard, and returned to crack the meet record of 21 4-10 seconds in the 220-yard dash a short time later by defeating two teammates in the fast time of 20 8-10 seconds.

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
