

# FORT BIDWELL CASE IS TOLD TO SENATORS

## Need For Help of Indians Pointed Out; Group Promises Action

Senators L. J. Frazier and Burton K. Wheeler of the senate sub-committee on Indian Affairs yesterday assured Col. Fred Dorris, Mitchell Tillotson and Roy Baker of Alturas and Dr. Charles E. Letthead, Lakeview, that the situation existing in Modoc county regarding the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

The sub-committee gave the opinion that existing conditions are deplorable and that the question of reopening the Fort Bidwell Indian school, closed last year, should receive further attention as should the rehabilitation of Indians in northern California.

Lands or other aid should be given the Indians to aid them in making their living and in fairness the Fort Bidwell school should be re-established to allow the children a chance for an education to fit themselves for life, was the sentiment of the committee. Mr. Tillotson stated following the committee meeting started on the train and completed after arrival in Klamath Falls.

The entire situation in Modoc county was placed before the committee.

# Kirkland Case Arouses Many Legal Points

VALPARAISO, Ind., May 27. (UP)—More controversy and more hickering surrounded the sentencing of Virgil Kirkland today to from 1 to 10 years in the state reformatory for his part in the tragic "Gary gin party" last fall.

The Indiana attorney general said the sentence was in error, several charged jurors said they believed their verdict last night carried with it a death sentence and the prosecutor announced he would "start action" unless Judge Grant Crumpacker reconsiders the sentence.

The jury found young Kirkland guilty of assault and battery with intent to commit rape in connection with the death of his sweetheart, 18-year-old Arlene Draves. The verdict carried with it an automatic imprisonment sentence.

Judge Crumpacker sentenced the youth on schedule after Attorney General James M. O'Gen had ruled in effect that the jury's verdict must stand, despite the belief of some of its members that they were sentencing Kirkland to death.

# VATICAN STATE PATROLLED TO HALT RIOTS

ROME, May 27. (UP)—A strong military guard patrolled the frontiers of Vatican State tonight to prevent recurrence of disorders and violence growing out of a serious strain on relations between the Holy See and the Fascist government.

A company of infantry was on duty at the approaches to the Papal state, under orders to suppress any demonstration hostile to the Vatican. A large squad of detectives guarded the side entrances to the Vatican and troops were on duty at the Victor Emmanuel bridge, which leads to the Vatican district. Police guards supplemented the soldiers.

The precautions were taken after demonstrations by fascist students, climaxing three days of charges and counter-charges made by fascist and catholic newspapers which alleged hostility toward the government of Premier Benito Mussolini by catholic authorities and mistreatment of members of catholic organizations by fascists. The semi-official vatican newspaper charged the outbreaks were due to "superior inspiration."

University students demonstrated today in front of the Rome seminary and the Gregorian university, shouting "long live fascism, long live Il Duce!" They attempted to rush the seminary and hurled stones which broke and forced the demonstrators to scatter.
