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PESTS DESTROYED IN KLAMATH AREA

More squirrels have been killed in a poisoning campaign over the county than at any period in the last five or six years, according to a statement from County Agent C. A. Henderson.

In the past 10 days the county agent's office has killed and distributed more than 4,000 pounds of squirrel poison. It is sold at stores over the county, and is also obtainable at the agent's office.

Present weather conditions are favorable, and it is highly desirable that squirrels should be poisoned at this time, according to Henderson. After the next 10 days or two weeks squirrels become sluggish and do not eat as readily, so the poison oats should be distributed at once.

The state law requires all land owners to destroy noxious rodents on their property, and requires that the poisoned oats be mixed by the county agent and sold to all landowners.

Poison oats are obtainable at Kallina's store at Mallin, at Ben Foss' store at Merrill, Mack's store at Henley, Sparretoria's at Bonanza and Bliss' store at Hildebrand. It may also be purchased at all times from the county agent's office.

GRAIN VALUES IN 2 CENT DECREASE

CHICAGO, June 14. (AP)—Wheat values, tumbled about 2c per bushel late today, owing largely to reports of Argentine opposition to acreage reduction moves at the world's economic conference.

Pessimism as to the conference outcome was expressed by many traders. Weakness of the stock market and a sharp decline in sterling were contributing bearish factors.

Wheat closed nervous, 1c to 1 1/2c under yesterday's finish; corn, 1c to 1 1/2c down; oats 1c to 1 1/2c off, and provisions at 1 1/2c to 2c decline.
