

TRUAX, KERNS TAKE OFFICES IN DISTRICT 1

Dr. L. L. Truax and J. W. Kerns, newly elected members on the board of school district No. 1, were sworn in Wednesday evening by Mrs. Edna Chambers, retiring chairman of the board, at a regular meeting held at Fremont school.

Charles W. Thomas, senior member of the board, assumed the chairmanship according to provisions of school law.

Approximately 20 representatives of the area affected by Conger school attended the board meeting, and presented a petition signed by 351 taxpayers of that district requesting the board to exert every possible effort to continue operation of that school.

Although at no time has the board definitely decided to close Conger school, this move was discussed and considered as a possible measure to reduce expenses in proportion to revenue taken in by the district.

At the Wednesday evening meeting the board announced that it would consider all possible ways and means by which to meet the requests of the Conger school delegation. These representatives pointed out to the board that closing of the school would result only a small saving in money to the district and that this saving would be counterbalanced by deterioration of the building and grounds from lack of use.

Members of the board declared that if taxpayers of district No. 1 would, and could pay their taxes, there would be no question but that Conger school could be kept open.

Regular business was transacted at the board meeting, and monthly bills allowed.

Although regular meetings of the district board are set for the first and third Wednesday evenings of each month, the clerk of the district announced that this schedule would be changed because of conflicting meetings.
