This meeting will be followed by a series of similar functions in the hope of establishing the factory, a new industry and a new crop.

A number of prominent speakers will address the meeting, among whom will be Roger W. Morse, dairy extension specialist of Oregon State College, who will discuss dairying, particularly with relation to the value of by-products of a sugar beet factory and the value of sugar beet raising to the dairying industry; George J. Cannon, agricultural agent of the Great Northern railway, will speak on the value of a sugar beet factory and a sugar beet crop to the community, with particular emphasis upon civic and community cooperation necessary to secure a factory of this kind; and C. A. Henderson, county agriculturalist, will present a report on sugar beet demonstrations and experiments as carried on in this county from 1925 to 1930 in cooperation with the Sacramento Valley Sugar company, the Utah-Idaho Sugar company and the Holley Sugar company.

Roy Tabor, president of the Civic Rotary club, will preside at the meeting.
