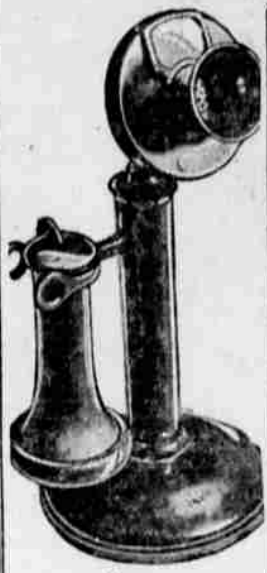

National, Local Markets

HEAVY BUYING RESPONDS TO DOLLAR DROP

NEW YORK, July 3. (AP)—Heavy buying rolled into the share and commodity markets today in response to the dollar's decline to new lows after publication of President Roosevelt's note to the economic conference.

Stocks rushed to new highs for the year and by early afternoon many issues had recorded gains of \$1 to around \$7 a share. Cotton jumped about \$2 a bale and dollar wheat reappeared on the Chicago board of trade.

Sterling exchange rose 12 1/2c to \$4.46 before subsiding several cents and the European gold currencies climbed to new highs.

Speculative enthusiasms ran high on the New York stock exchange. Traders, reading President Roosevelt's statement, noted particularly the emphasis he placed on the importance of maintaining the domestic price hitting program.

Profit taking imposed temporary checks on the advance, but the upward trend was decisive throughout the earlier hours. Sales to noon totaled 2,900,000 shares and large blocks were plentifully sprinkled over the trading tape.

U. S. Steel climbed \$2 to \$25, while the preferred sold at \$10.00 a share. 11 1/2 before Saturday's close. Union Pacific reached \$7.50. All other shares were \$1.50 to \$2.50. Chemicals \$5.50 to \$12.50. Case \$6.75 to \$9.75 and Deere \$5.50 to \$6.87. American telephone rose \$1.37 to \$13.87.

News that the Reconstruction Finance corporation was making a loan to finance sales of cotton to Russia appeared to be a factor in that staple's advance. It was reported efforts might be made by Russia to obtain additional financial aid for purchases of farm machinery.

Steel shares were stimulated by further improvement in the operating ratio.

MARKET PRICES GO UNCHANGED AT PORTLAND

PORTLAND, July 3. (AP)—There was little, if any, material change in the price on cheese during the week. Values were about steady. Tillamook maintained its price list and Coon Bay indicated sales at former values although here and there suggestion was made of slightly shaded figures.

Cheese production in the country generally showed a rather fair increase during the first five months of the year.

Market for butter continued to reflect a generally steady to strong tone here. There was no change in the price on the open market. Butterfat remained firmly priced at all points, list and Coon Bay indicated sales at former values although here and there suggestion was made of slightly shaded figures.

Trade in the live poultry market was cleaning up each day with prices held fully steady. Bids of killers were somewhat mixed with some still inclined to pay star prices for heavy colored broilers.

New Spuds Drop

There was a rather good call for dressed hen turkeys here and prices were steady to firm and fractionally higher in spots. As high as 17c lb. was reported for selections. New broilers were in fair call.

First of the new crop apples were here. The Yakima section has the honor. The initial stock consisted of several full boxes of Yellow Transparent which were priced \$1.75 in a small way. Old crop continued in call.

Market for cherries was in bad shape with sales of Bing in 15c as low as 75c and growers unable to clean up at that. Poor cherries were hard to move at any price.

A local scrap between brokers caused the price on new potatoes to drop here while primary points report well sustained values. In fact potatoes were being offered here down to the 7c. a. b. mark.

Women May Boycott Places Selling Beer

MILWAUKEE, Wis., July 3. (UP)—A national boycott of drugists and grocers who sell beer was proposed to the Women's Christian Temperance Union today by its president, Mrs. Ella Hoole.

She recommended that a resolution be adopted by the W. C. T. U. national convention here providing that "each local union ask its members and the influential women of the community to appeal personally to stores which they patronize, asking them not to obtain licenses for the sale of beer and that our members be urged to give preference to dealers, corporations and institutions who refuse to share in the profits of the liquor business."
