 over the northern Pacific and Bering sea at the time Matern disappeared.
 James J. Matern, 28-year-old Texan, left New York at 5:29 p. m. on June 2 on an ambitious attempt to fly alone around the world and lower the record set by Harold Gatty and Wiley Post in 1931. He reached Khabarovsk, Siberia, near the Pacific, on June 14, and took off on the hazardous flight across the Bering Strait to Nome, Alaska, after being forced back by ice-coated wings the day previous.
 Nothing further was heard from him and it was feared he had been lost. An extensive search revealed no clue.

 river, flogged her, bound her and buried her alive.
 Emphatic denials were lodged by Bustamante, an official of the Filipino lodge, as the defense attorneys sought to impeach his testimony in cross examination. He denied he choked Mrs. Novarro to death in a hall at Stockton, November 20.
 He denied he gagged her with

his hand while killing her. He denied he pointed a gun at others in the room and forced them to sign a paper pledging secrecy.

Louis Totman, deputy sheriff of San Joaquin county, testified that Bustamante reported the crime to him April 1. He and other officers, directed by Bustamante, found the grave covered by four inches of ash and removed the woman's body.
 Mrs. Novarro's hands were tied behind her back, at the elbows, and her legs were bound at the knees, said Totman. He told of arresting five of the defendants in nearby labor camps.

No definite check of the injured and missing was possible, however, pending re-establishment of communications. All bridges along the canyon were washed out and cars could not reach Starbuck or Evergreen.

Parties Organized
 Rescue parties started out on foot about the canyon as dusk settled. Starbuck is a community of about 150 persons, and one report said not a house had been left standing there. Evergreen is slightly larger. No reports had been received from that point.

In Morrison the streets were a shambles. Bear creek runs through the very center of the town.

The flood waters had destroyed three residences completely. All basements in the town were flooded. Household goods had been washed into the center of the street.

The Mt. Morrison garage, a brick building, was swept away by the flood.
