Recovers From Operation—William Connolly has returned to his home at 73 Pine street, after recovering from a minor operation.

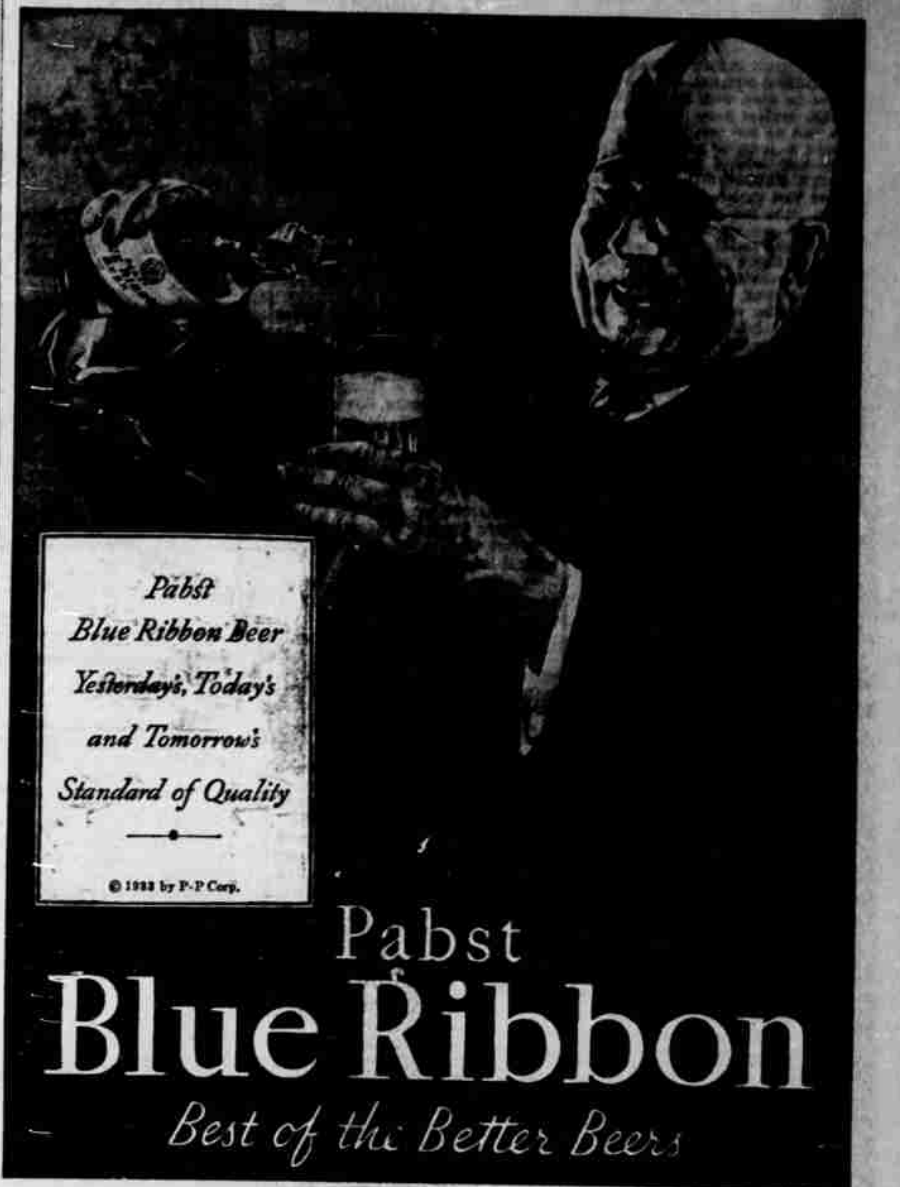
