PORTLAND, July 10, (AP) - Market for cheese continued to reflect steadiness in most positions through the domestic trade. Demand locally has been considered sufficient to hold prices at least unchanged, with a slight showing of strength in the under-tone. A greater speculative demand for cheese to move into coolers is apparent in the leading producing territory.

There was no change suggested in latest advices from Tillamook. Production through the Pacific Northwest was decreasing somewhat with the "flush" period passed some time ago.

There continued a liberal showing of strength in the market for butter locally on the open trade, with prices well sustained. Make continued to show decrease in this territory. Butterfat was firm.

There was a somewhat better general undertone in the egg market here, with prices more generally maintained for top grade stuff, although some short held storage was said to be moving at various sales.

Market for live chickens reflected weakness as a result of the dumping of supplies by scared producers, who were unloading their surplus with higher feed costs.

All country killed meats were showing at least steadiness in the local trade. Hogs and lambs were steady to firm at full prices listed for extreme quality.

Announcement of the first local young berries due this season were made. In all 30 crates were due from the school district, with some sales made at \$1.50 per crate.

More new crop Yellow Trans-parent apples were arriving from Central Washington. Prices were generally lower, with the bulk of supplies in jumble boxes. Sales down to \$1.15 to \$1.25 per box.

Notes of wholesale trading - Strawberries were scarce and higher. Currants were in small supply but in slow demand. California tomatoes generally lower.
