

SAILBOAT VICTORS TO GET PENNANTS

The skippers winning first and second places in the sailboat race to be held on Klamath Lake, Sunday at 3:00 will each receive a pennant to be flown from his mast. The pennant for first place, having a white sailboat on a background of blue felt, is being donated by the Junior Chamber of Commerce. The pennant for second place, donated by the Pelican Tire company, is a smaller replica of the first prize. They will be awarded at the officials' boat immediately after the race and will become the permanent property of the winners. The pennants are now on display at the chamber of commerce.

Prizes to be entered in the snapshot contest for the best pictures of the sailboats taken at the race Sunday must be turned in at the chamber of commerce by 5 o'clock on Wednesday, July 19. No entries will be accepted from officials or contestants. ARLINGTON CLASSIC TO BE ON SATURDAY

CHICAGO, July 14 (UP)—Blue Larkspur in 1929. Gallant Fox in 1930. . . . Mate in 1931. . . . Gusto in 1932.

Those are the four good and game thoroughbreds who have raced to victory in the Arlington classic which will be renewed Saturday at Arlington Park.

To find the winner of the fifth renewal of one of the most famous races in the west, Chicago turf devotees tonight scanned their charts, tip sheets and past performance records but with no great success.

A field of 15 is likely to go to the post in the \$35,000 added, mile and a quarter race, and no one has been able to find the favorite yet.

"It looks like a wide open race," commented Charles A. McCulloch, Chicago capitalist and chairman of the board of directors of the Arlington Park Jockey club. "Every single colt and filly of notable ability in the 2-year-old division is entered, and the race should crown a champion."

The favorite may be the Catwawa farm's Mr. Khayyam, winner of the American derby, Wood Memorial and Chesapeake stakes, or Mrs. S. B. Mason's Head Play, Freshness winner and second in the Kentucky derby, or Morton L. Schwartz's Gold Basis, winner of the Latonia derby and stable mate of Gusto, last year's classic victor.

Others Threaten
Mr. Khayyam, Head Play and Gold Basis are three of the most formidable, but the winner may not even be among that trio. It may be found among The Darb, winner of Withers mile at Belmont, Golden Way, second in the Withers mile, War Glory, son of Man o' War and winner of the Dwyer Stakes, Barn Swallow, Col. E. R. Bradley's filly which won the Kentucky Oaks, Sarada, son of Sir Galahad III and winner of the Hyde Park stakes Tuesday at Arlington, Okapi, a highly touted western colt, and Kerry Patch, long shot winner of the Belmont Futurity last year.

Persian Film To Be Shown At Church
