Post In Siberia Ahead Of Record;

Round-World Airman 10 Hours Ahead of His Old Record; Lithuanian Flight Ends In Crash Short Way From Destination

MOSCOW, Tuesday, July 18. (UP)—Wiley Post, racing against time around the world to set a new record, took off from the alredrome at Novosibirsk, Siberia, on the fifth leg of his flight at 8:55 a. m., Moscow time today (1:55 a. m., E. D. T.)

Post stopped in Novosibirsk only two hours and 36 minutes. He landed there at 6:19 a. m. (11:19 p. m., Monday, E. D. T.)

Post was bound for either lirkutsk or Chita en route to Khabarovak on the far eastern coast of Siberia. It was raining at Irkutsk, 900 miles to the east, and the landing field there was poor, so it was believed that Post might continue to Chita before stopping for a few hours' rest. He planned to reach Khabarovak to spend the night.
