Judge Dropped By Brooklyn; Player Injured

NEW YORK, July 25, (AP)—The Brooklyn Dodgers of the National league announced today the unconditional release of Joe Judge, veteran first baseman, who was signed this spring by the Brooklyn team after 17 years with the Washington Athletics.

Judge was spiked a few days after he joined the Dodgers, and has played little since that time, and a few weeks ago the club acquired Sam Leslie, a first baseman, from the New York Giants.

Judge, a native of New York, was 35 last May, and has been in organized baseball since 1914, when he played with Lewiston in the New England league, and the next season with Buffalo, which sold him to the Senators for \$4000 and two players. He remained with the Washington team until his release this spring.

Judge has a lifetime major league batting average of .239 and played in two world series with the Senators, 1924 and 1925. His best year was 1920, when he batted .333 in 126 games.
