OFFICERS ARREST INDIAN FUGITIVES

Three Klamath Indians who stole a government truck while serving on a work sentence at Klamath Agency Sunday and burned the door from the jail at Beatty Sunday night after being apprehended by Indian officers, were again in custody Tuesday.

Cy Hutchinson, LeRoy Hood and Bennett Weeks were the three Indians who grew tired of working under sentence. Sunday they took a department of interior truck and drove to Beatty but were met by reservation officers and placed in jail where they were to be held before being brought to Klamath Falls and taken to Portland on federal larceny charges.

Sunday night they burned the door from the jail and escaped only to be picked up again Monday after attempting to make a get-away.

McKinley George and his brother, Dean George, held on charges of being drunk are believed by county officers to have been connected with the three in assisting the jail break Sunday night.

GRAIN BUYERS CONFIDENT IN CHICAGO PITS

CHICAGO, Aug. 1. (AP)—Dramatic reversal of grain market behavior took place today, and all the speculative pits were filled with orders to buy instead of to sell.

Except for a brief period early, however, when prices rose buoyantly to the topmost point possible under new emergency rules, an artificial deadlock prevailed, and trading was almost at a standstill, but with buyers again confident, whereas yesterday they were dismayed. The reason for the deadlock was that buyers were restrained from bidding above definite upward boundaries, and that sellers below such boundaries today were practically non-existent.

General belief was expressed that before the end of the week normal conditions would be restored, although regulations which prohibited extreme advances or declines would remain in effect.

Wheat closed strong at the day's top level, 1c over yesterday's finish, corn 4c up, oats 5c advanced, and provisions showing a uniform gain of 50 cents.

PORTLAND, Aug. 1. (AP)—Market for cereals clearly showed the effects of hot weather together with cries from the country of too close culling. The market may safely be considered steady for selected stock. Much of the so-called extras were in reality of larger size and were being sold at the price for the former.

Receipts were fairly liberal considering the season and no shortage exists. Cash buyers at country points were able to get all their needs with ease.

One in the market for better duty, the price of the late season of the produce exchange was unchanged, those in control there keeping Portland prices below those of Seattle. Latter market appeared weakest on the coast.
