Fehl Claims He's Innocent; Writes Own Version Here

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was given because all of those indicted were barred from testifying save and except when they entered pleas of guilty and from the mouths of the various state witnesses that had so pleaded guilty no evidence was given that the dictator of these lines took any part whatsoever in the promotion and commission of this crime against society which in its true analysis is political.

In the bosom of some of the defendants and no doubt in the bosom of many people who were not made defendants lies the truth relative to the conspiracy as charged by the state.

State Position Discussed.
The state's position was not actuated by any desire to punish for the commission of a crime but the entire motive appearing behind the investigation, trials and conviction was a desire on the part of certain well entrenched politicians who wished to regain both the office of sheriff of Jackson county and that of county judge. As evidence of this fact as soon as my case was ended, the state moved to dismiss the other remaining indictments although it was well known to the prosecution that at least some of these defendants were not alone guilty of conspiring to commit the crime but actually participated in the crime.

As disclosed by the state's attorney in argument before the jury that a man could be accused and convicted of a conspiracy and not be implicated in any way or even be near the commission of the crime, which argument, if looked upon as evidence, impels every American citizen to watch his step for had I, as county judge, been in Timbuctoo as argued by the council, I would still be subject to indictment and conviction as I would had I been at the courthouse on the evening of the commission of this crime.

In summing up the situation, I believe I am safe in saying if the only crime that I have committed and which crime I plead guilty to is the fact that the good people of Jackson county elected me as county judge and failed to elect the candidate desired by the politicians which has controlled Jackson county for many years.

If the time shall come, which I sincerely hope it will, when men will mount the witness stand and tell the truth, so help them God, that no jury could return a verdict of guilty against your humble servant who is now facing a four year sentence for a political crime that he was no more aware of at the time of the commission or prior thereto than the good people of Klamath Falls.

The cross that I am called upon to bear must be borne alone. The jury has spoken. The judgment rendered. An innocent man is now paying the price for having been elected to the highest position of public trust in Jackson county in direct opposition to the political forces now back in power due to the successful termination of the state's case clothed under the broad and sweeping provision of the conspiracy statute of the state of Oregon.

Fehl Warns Citizens.
My good friends, I ask you now from behind prison bars to immediately take steps to protect your life, liberty and property by bringing at once to the attention of our law makers, our courts and lastly our jury, the awfulness of the grasp of a conspiracy charge. And its results as is evidenced in my case.

Failing to do this may an innocent man will be railroaded to the penitentiary, his home and his fortunes swept away as is in the instant case of the state versus Earl H. Fehl, who today stands a martyr brought

to this cross by the statutes, I am urging you to take heed of. This is respectfully submitted in your interest and your home as my case is a closed book. The judge says four years. I raise the question, what for?

Labor Will Assist Recovery Board in Check on Support

The coal strike and all its issues are in the background of the coal code negotiations which begin here tomorrow.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 8. (AP)— Grocers and retailers, under fair practice codes submitted to the NRA, have agreed to regulations for their industries for the purpose of industrial recovery.

Maximum hours of labor and minimum rates of pay for employees definitely fixed.

Here is what is expected of those engaged in food and grocery distributing trade:
Opening Hours Announced.
Maximum hours of labor shall be 48 hours per week. No one shall be employed more than eight hours in any 24-hour period excepting on a day preceding a

legal holiday and on an additional 12 days (when the maximum hours shall not exceed 16 hours) in any six months period.

In the presidential agreement, the minimum hours of any store which customarily operated more than 52 hours were set at 52 hours. The average number of hours in which retail grocers were open was said by their national committee to be 73.

Containing to shorten hours might lose business, the grocers were allowed a 48-hour work week for employees.

NRA officials, however, have explained if store hours are reduced by agreement to below 52, the re-employment which is anticipated through the allowance of the 48-hour work week will not be obtained, and the understanding upon which the food and grocery distributors, and the re-union system, were based will not have been carried out.

Where store or service operations were less than 52 hours per week before July 1, 1933, however, the minimum requirement does not apply, but the previous hours shall not be reduced.

These maximum hours do not apply to employees in establishments employing not more than two persons in towns of less than 2,500 population, nor to employees in executive or managerial jobs who now receive more than \$35 per week. Outside salesmen or delivery men, employees on emergency maintenance and repair work, and special cases where restriction of hours would unavoidably reduce production also are excepted. But in such cases at least time and one-third shall be paid for hours worked in excess of the maximum.

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ployes not under contract would be limited to 40 hours a week except that they might work a maximum of 44 hours a week for any six weeks within any six months period. Maximum hour provisions would not apply to professional persons nor to executives receiving more than \$35 a week.

Business office employees would be paid on a graduated scale ranging from a minimum of \$12 a week in towns of less than 2500 population to a minimum of \$15 a week in cities of more than 500,000 population. Such full time employees would be paid as much for the shorter week as paid heretofore in event full time is worked.
