GRAIN VALUES ON UP SWING; WHEAT SOARS

CHICAGO, Aug. 10. (AP)—For the third successive day, grain values showed an advancing trend today, with wheat registering nearly 6 cents rise, compared with Tuesday's bottom figures.
Increased attention was given to reports of the Washington administration's desire to see prices restricted to the level which prevailed in 1924-25. According to official returns, the average 1925 price received by the farmer was \$1.24 a bushel; corn, 74 cents, and oats, 40 cents.
