STATE MARKET INFLUENCED BY OUTSIDE EGGS

PORTLAND, Aug. 21. (AP)—Eggs from outside the state were believed behind a movement today that indicated retail selling at a price equaling or below that quoted to retailers by distributors, making it extremely difficult to maintain prices except on extreme top grades. Prices, however, remained unchanged.

Market for butter was without quotable change in the open trade for the week's start.

Market for cheese showed weakness here and in the East. Storage accumulations were chiefly against the immediate market. Price remained stationary.

Potatoes—Active. Weakness continued in the market for light and medium weight hens in the live poultry trade, but heavy stuff and broilers are inclined to hold rather well.

Market for country killed meats was at full last week's final prices. The only exception to the generally steady to firm tone remained in poor grade beef.

Market on tomatoes received a setback during the day, with greatly increased offerings from Yakima, as well as liberal ones from the Dalles.

Still further spurt of strength was suggested in peach prices here and along the coast. Prices are steady to 5c higher in spots on Elbertas and J. H. Hales with limited local canning offerings firm.

Notes of Wholesale Trading Green peppers in over-supply and lower.

Sweet potatoes down. New potatoes were active at unchanged prices.

Mountain huckleberries were down to a dime a pound. Cucumbers slightly more active. Apple market was trifle slow, but unchanged in price.

Dillard cantaloupes were lower.

Moderately active, steady to strong; sheep steady to 25c higher; two loads fairly good uniform 950 lb. fed California steers \$5.50; 80 head medium and good uneven 1075 lb. fed \$5.50; two cars 1115-1224 lb. \$5-\$5.35; load feeders 34; few heifer calves \$4; 1165 lb. range cows \$3.50, weighty dairy type \$2.50; \$1.75-\$2; bulls quotable to \$3.75.

Sheep: 3100, including 650 direct, 30 holders. Cull, mostly wooled Oregon and California lambs, general quality under that of last week, choice scarce; considering quality, some bids weak to fairly; three decks used and good 76-77 lb. wooled Oregon lambs \$6.50, 10 per cent \$5.50; best wooled available held around \$7.
