With 90 boys enrolled in the 4-H Garden clubs this past summer, and most of them bringing exhibits, visitors will be able to see just what boys can do in the way of raising a garden under competent instruction. A. C. Olson, principal of Altamont school, has led the Altamont garden clubs all during the summer, and he, with Frank W. Sexton, county club agent, has visited practically every garden and given individual advice to the boys in this work. Mrs. H. V. Dow, who lives on the Keno road, has been leader of a garden club of 15 boys and girls, and many exhibits will come from those gardens. Most of these gardens supplied garden truck for the entire family during the summer, and the boys are to be commended on such fine work. Each garden exhibit is to contain five different varieties of vegetables. Not much has been said of the 4-H Forestry club work, although there were two fine Forestry clubs in the county this year. This is a new project being sponsored by 4-H clubs, and this is the first year the work has been done in Klamath county.
