

CUBA AFFAIRS DISCUSSED AT STOCK PROBE

WASHINGTON, Oct. 26. (AP)—A conference between Sumner Welles, American ambassador to Cuba, and Chase National bank officials just before the diplomat left for the island was described to senate investigators today in a letter from the bank's files.

The letter from A. K. Gelsler said Welles had conferred with W. W. Aldrich, president of the bank, and other officials about conditions in Cuba.

This letter was presented just after the senate stock committee decided to keep off the public records another dispatch from a Chase official in New York to one of the bank's representatives in Havana.

It followed, too, presentation of a letter by a representative of the bank in Cuba, saying that Cuban cabinet members were getting "big graft" out of public works, which Chase was helping to finance.

The letter about Welles follows:

"As you know, President Roosevelt has appointed Mr. Sumner Welles to be ambassador to Cuba. Mr. Welles was in the office yesterday and talked with Mr. Aldrich, Mr. Morgan, Mr. Rosenthal and myself. He expects to sail, I think, on Thursday of this week.

Ready to Aid Welles
"Rosenthal gave Mr. Welles quite a bit of background, and in response to Mr. Welles' questions, outlined as nearly as any one can outline the present financial position of the government. Mr. Welles did not, however, indicate to us just what is in his mind with respect to Cuba, but in closing the interview, we suggested that our Havana office would be very happy to be of any assistance possible to him. He accepted this suggestion, and stated that he expected to avail himself of our information and service.

"This note is to tell you of the meeting, and to say that you may put yourself on a confidential basis with Mr. Welles. Shortly after his arrival, it would be a good idea for you to call at the embassy and meet Mr. Welles and again offer your services.

Welles Recommended
"We have been unable to find a complete record of Mr. Welles to furnish you. He is a career man and is very highly spoken of as being most capable. For your strictly personal and confidential information, he impresses us as being rather stand-offish in his attitude, and not inclined to take anyone into his confidence.

"He may, therefore, be somewhat difficult to get on an entirely satisfactory basis with, but I am quite sure that you will be able to establish friendly relations."

Busy Beavers Hard at Work For Cougars

Don Wagner, 225-pound Pacific northwest amateur heavyweight wrestling champion, is being groomed to relieve either Harry Field or Tar Schwammel at either tackle position. Mush Dunkin, one of the fastest men on the squad, has been shifted from fullback to right halfback and may see action against the Cougars as relief man for Pierre Bowman, the hard-hitting Hawaiian.
