KRUSE LOOSES TO CANTONWINE

Heavyweights Battle In First Match Since Disqualification

Chesty Howard Cantonwine of Iowa upset Bob Kruse of Oawaco last night in the Legion hall main event wrestling match. It was the first appearance the two giants had made together since their disqualification in San Francisco last summer.

It was a long, laborious match falling just a few minutes short of the full hour limit. Kruse, more skillful in the application of holds, held a distinct advantage until Cantonwine, coming out of a series of short-arm scissors, swarmed all over the farmer.

Kruse won the first fall in 29 minutes and 55 seconds with a body press. He had weakened the 240-pound giant from the midwest with a half dozen shoulder butts sufficiently strong to lift Cantonwine from his feet.

Cantonwine, turning rough after losing the first hold, tossed Kruse back and forth among the ropes, tangled his neck between the cords and at last held him to the mat with a body press. He captured the fall in 11 minutes and 35 seconds.

Myers Wins Match The third fall, like the two preceding, was won with a body press. Cantonwine broke from a short-arm scissors and crushed the Oawaco farmer to the floor.

In the semi-windup Sailor Franz won from Bob Myers with a headlock in the first fall. Myers then took the next two to win the match. Myers got his first fall with a headlock and the second with an airplane spin and body press.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 27, (AP)—The Washington Post said today that Robert Moses (Lefty) Grove, star of the Philadelphia Athletics pitching staff, has been sold to the Boston Red Sox.
