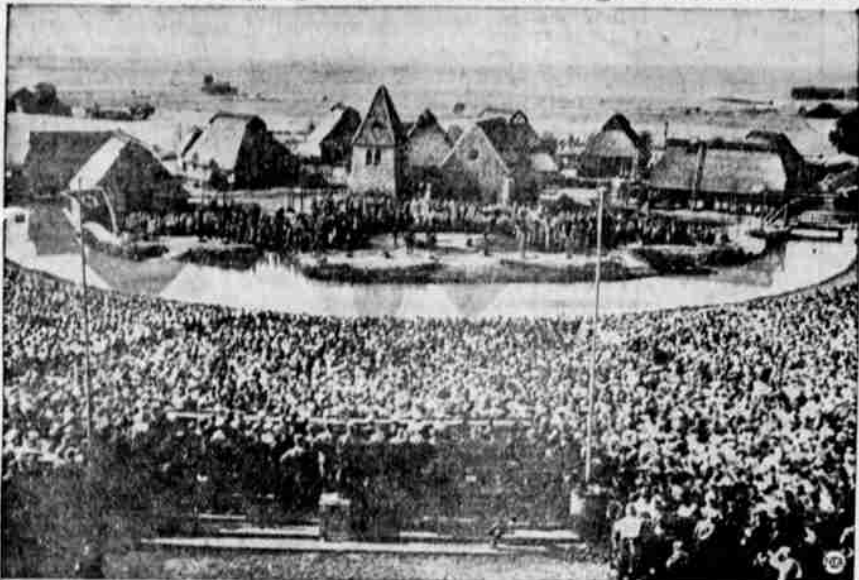


Pictorial Review of Today's News

Nazis Thronging Old-World Village Celebration



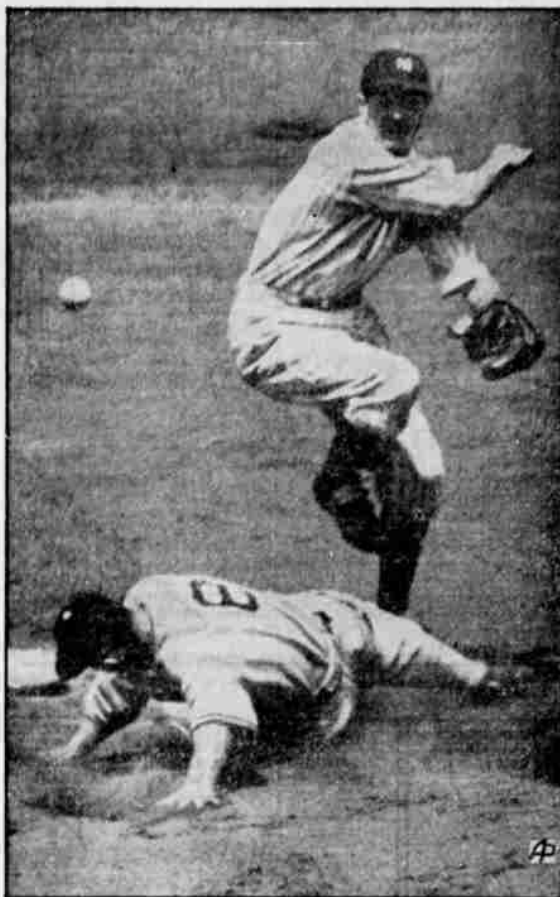

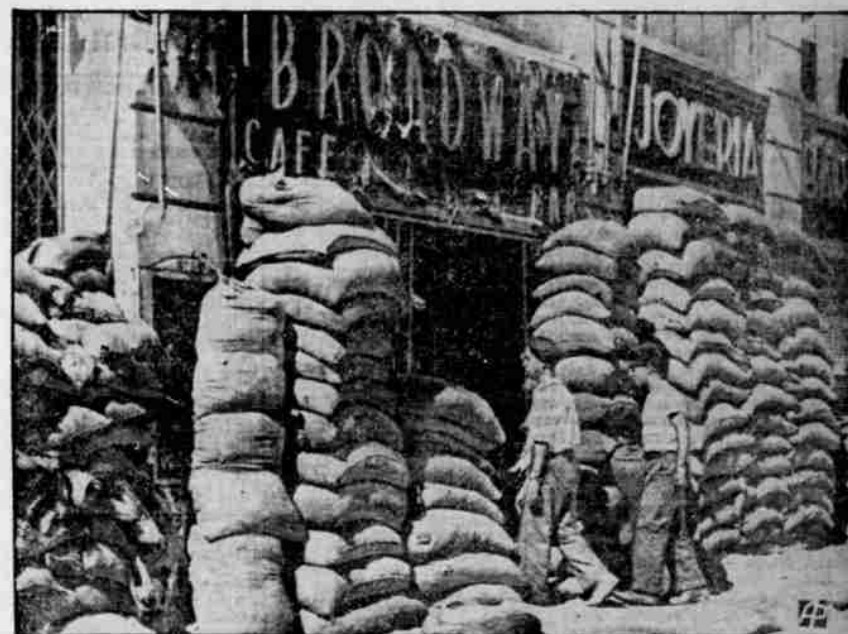
