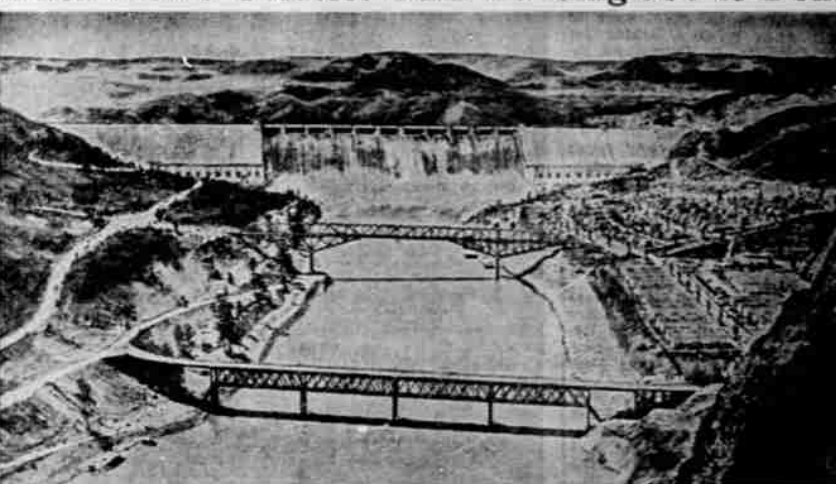

When Man's Greatest Dam Building Job Is Done



The biggest dam construction job man has ever attempted is under way in the Columbia River in Washington, where the Government is building the Grand Coulee Dam to generate electrical power for irrigation of 1,300,000 acres and supplying vast agricultural and industrial enterprises in the Pacific Northwest. This composite picture, with drawings superimposed on a photograph, shows the job as it will look when completed. The dam will be 4900 feet long, raising the upper level of the river 350 feet. On either side of the spillway will be two power plants, each ultimately to contain nine generators of 105,000 kilowatt capacity, driven by the biggest hydraulic turbines ever built. Coulee Dam, the town at the right, is project headquarters and will remain to house operating employees.
