

JUNIOR DRUM CORPS TRAINS FOR ALBANY

For the first time in drum corps history in Klamath Falls, a junior drum corps will march with the American Legion drum corps, playing the same music and going through the same maneuvers as their elders.

This is the result of the organization of Legionnaires' sons who have developed a splendid Junior American Legion drum corps to be heard Saturday night at 7:30 o'clock, July 31, prior to the annual pre-convention dance slated for that night at the armory.

The boys have snappy new uniforms including neat navy blue overalls, white shirts and black ties, and white trousers with a navy blue stripe.

It is the plan of the American Legion drum corps to take the youngsters to Albany for the state convention, August 11, 12, 13 and 14 where the Legionnaires will defend their state championship against all-comers. The junior drum corps will be an innovation at the state meet.

One of the features of Saturday night's pre-convention dance will be the appearance of the junior drum corps on the floor during intermission where they will go through their drill which they will present at the state season next month.

MULTNOMAH FREE OF GAMBLING

PORTLAND, July 29 (AP)—Sheriff Martin Pratt advised John A. Jeffrey, district manager of the Townsend organization, that with the exceptions of Portland and Gresham, Multnomah county was free from organized gambling.

He said that Gresham's ordinance licensing certain types of pin-ball games was "undoubtedly a violation of the law" but that he believed it was the city's "own particular business." If they wished to derive revenue from that source.

"So far as Troutdale, Corbett and Bonview or other places in the county are concerned, I again say there is no organized gambling," the sheriff said.

PORTLAND, July 29 (AP)—Dave Beck, coast head of the teamsters' union, testified that brewery workers who ignored an AFOL ruling giving the teamsters jurisdiction over the delivery of beer precipitated the "beer war" between the two unions.

He was a witness at the hearing on an order by Federal Judge James Alger Fee restraining the teamsters' union from interfering with delivery of "Red Label" beer.

Stronganoff's Widow Wins At Last His Huge Fortune

PARIS, July 29 (UP)—After 14 years of litigation the famous millions of the former Russian count, Serge Stronganoff, today were the legal property of his widow, Rose Angeline Henriette Lewitze Stronganoff.

When the decision on the will is pronounced tomorrow by the court of appeals at Aix En Provence, terminating one of the greatest inheritance hoaxes of recent decades, the widow will become the richest exile of Russian czarist regime.

At one time the count's fortune was valued at \$40,000,000 but most of it was confiscated by the Soviet government. About \$2,000,000, however, is on deposit in banks of London and New York. In addition there is a

palatial home in Rome, art treasures in Berlin, and valuable properties on the Riviera.

The hoax, which brought Nicholas Stronganoff, an impoverished Russian exile, into fabulous debt, magnificent titles and ruined dozens of his gullible creditors, began in 1923 when Stronganoff learned of the death of the multi-millionaire count and realized that by changing a single vowel of his name he might win millions away from Stronganoff's widow.

Nicholas then emerged from his poor garret, attached a noble title to his name, bought a flashy table of genealogy and laid siege to the aged and deaf Stronganoff aunt in order to obtain family documents to substantiate his claims.

By a skillful legal ruse he brought the papers into his pos-

session and with clever wiles won the confidence of the Stronganoff widow, who invited the pretender nephew into her home.

When Nicholas' creditors began to clamor for payment he tried to get the money from his benefactor, but instead found himself in the courts. By the time the case came up he was in Switzerland, having been expelled from France.

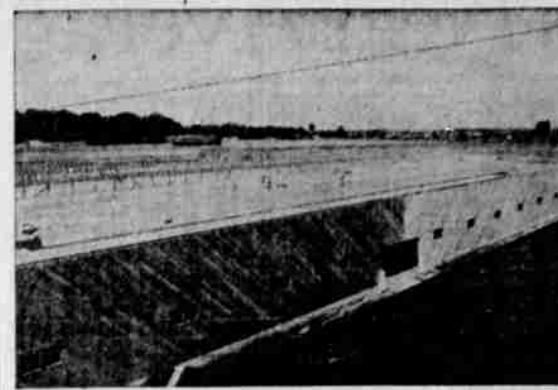
Through the long years the lawyers argued the case and gradually broke down the involved genealogy which "Count" Nicholas used to establish his family tree.

Nicholas meanwhile has passed from garret to grandeur to the grave.
