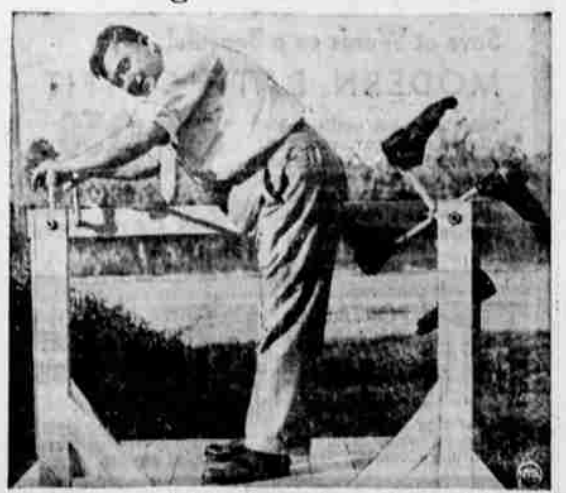
Guess What She Has Under Her Hat
