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VOTE ON BOND ISSUE DUE IN MID-OCTOBER

Mayor Clifton Richmond said Thursday that it now appears the city election on proposed bond issues will be held in mid-October. The mayor stated that this date is later than had been expected and is disappointing in that he had hoped the election might be held before the city budget is prepared for 1938.

Various factors are entering into the delay on calling the election, and when a date is determined upon, the council must pass the necessary legislation.

City Attorney D. E. Van Vactor was sent to Portland this week to confer with bond attorneys regarding the forthcoming election.

As now planned, there will be 14 separate issues on the ballot, 13 of them for bond issues and one for a special levy. The special levy would provide money for street flush-coating. Mayor Richmond pointed out that this matter will affect the budget, and for that reason it had been hoped the budget could be prepared after the election.

The mayor Thursday received from the Long Bell Lumber company estimates on the amount of damage to its property to result from the Main street underpass construction. The estimate was something over \$26,000, but he said he understood the company will accept the \$25,000 original figure. The city and the railroad company will share this damage. An item in the proposed bond issue will provide the city's share.

NEW YORK (UP)—Major Al Williams, well-known speed and test pilot, was in a hospital to night with a cracked knee cap. The daredevil, who has had many narrow escapes from death and injury, cracked up when he fell two feet from a Pullman berth while en route from Pittsburgh to New York. BAPTIST CHURCH AUTHORIZED IN ALTAMONT AREA

The First Baptist church has unanimously approved a recommendation of the board of deacons and trustees to sponsor and support a Baptist mission and church to serve the suburban areas such as Homedale, Altamont, Pleasant View and Fairacres tracts. It was announced Thursday. This mission is to be located in the home of Dr. C. B. Cassel on the corner of South Sixth street and Miller's lane.

At the same time the church approved a license to be granted to Dr. Cassel to preach the gospel and to conduct the new work.

In the near future the First Baptist church will conduct a house-to-house canvass of the district inviting those living there who might be interested in such a project to give it their interest and support.

TIBBETTS, BONELLI IN UNION QUARREL

NEW YORK, Aug. 25 (AP)—Steinway hall, where Lawrence Tibbett and Richard Bonelli have sung liquid notes, rang with cheers today when Alfred Salmagrand announced neither of them can really sing — "they're just lucky."

The occasion was a meeting of the Grand Opera Artists' association, affiliate of the American Federation of Labor, which frowns on the American Guild of Musical Artists.

Tibbett and Bonelli head the guild, and other high-priced stars are members.

"Tibbett can't sing. He's just lucky!" said Salmagrand, maestro of the New York Hippodrome opera, "and that goes for Bonelli, too."

"Why, neither of them could sing in my theatre for more than \$15 a night—and they have the nerve to call these artists mediocre!"

Bonelli angered the artists' association when he said recently: "No one who doesn't earn \$10,000 a year has a right to call himself a grand opera artist."

DRIVER CONVICTED
OF DRUNK CHARGE

Frank Marinneau, northern Klamath lumber mill employee, was convicted of drunken driving and given a \$100 fine in justice court here, the aftermath of an automobile accident north of Chemult in which Mr. and Mrs. C. O. Dryden of this city were injured.

Officers said witnesses told them that Marinneau was not only drunk at the time of the accident, but that he took another drink out of a bottle in his car after the mishap and then "hit up" passing motorists for drinks. Finally, they declared, he went to sleep in his car.

Marinneau's auto driver's license was revoked. He was given a

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
