District Attorney Hardin Blackmer, who announced the in-quest, said that no charges have been filed and action in that con-nection will await the outcome of the inquiry.

Denver Crowe, 53, rooming house proprietor who has admit-ted to officers he shot Crowe, but says he did it to protect himself from physical attack, is being held at the county jail.

An autopsy conducted by Dr. J. G. Patterson and Dr. George Adler, coroner, Saturday morning, show-ed that the builet which struck Baldwin entered his left breast, ranged through both lungs and his

It was a .22 short bullet fired from a target pistol, with which Crowe had armed himself early Friday morning, apparently antici-pating trouble with Baldwin.

District Attorney Blackmer said that he had obtained statements from the half dozen lumber employes who live at the Crowo rooming house, and were there at the time of trouble Thursday night and Friday morning.


