

WHEAT HITS HIGH AT MARKET CLOSE

CHICAGO, Oct. 15 (AP)—High prices today for wheat came in late dealings, with December closing \$1.008, a net gain of 2 1/2 cents a bushel overnight. The spread between Chicago and Liverpool prices widened out to the largest difference of the season. Official reports of Argentine rainfall this week and under normal in the north, indicating further decrease in the drought area. At the close, wheat was 1 1/2-2 1/2 cents above yesterday's finish, at \$1.004-1.008, May \$1.004 to \$1.008, and oats \$0.54, May \$0.54-60, and oats \$0.54.

DECLINE PERSISTS IN PINE BUSINESS

PORTLAND, Oct. 15 (AP)—Exports from 115 mills showed a week's new business of 57,000 board feet of lumber, 10 per cent below the previous week's mark, the Western Lumber association said today. Production totaled 79,159,000 board feet, a decrease of 10,000,000 board feet, a decrease of 10 per cent. Exports and shipments were substantially below the corresponding week of 1936. To date, orders were reported 10 per cent higher than last year.

BOSTON WOOL
 BOSTON, Oct. 15 (AP)—A decline in trading was done on fine stem grown wools in today's market. Prices, however, were regular because of holders' various ideas of values and extremely limited demand. Sales consisted mostly of small clips, no size lines being reported in most transactions. Prices on fine territory clips were below 80 cents, scoured lots in some cases out sales at this level were reported only on inferior wools or discolored lots. A few fine territory wools of scambing length sold around 85 cents, scoured basis at houses wanted at least 85 cents. Large lots of good French scambing length. Some asked 90 cents.

NEW YORK, Oct. 15 (AP)—Dips and rallies, each fast enough to put the ticker tape several minutes behind, alternated with bewildering frequency in today's stock market.

The list fell at the opening but quickly rebounded under leadership of U. S. Steel and others in this group. Rapid buying soon spread to virtually all sections except the motors. Weakness of Chrysler, off five points at the worst, then chilled the recovery swing and net gains running to three or more points were cut down substantially in later dealings.

While steels held sizable portions of their advance, many former favorites failed to join the move and trends were highly mixed at the close. New lows for the past two years or longer were plentiful.

Trading slowed in the final period. Transfers were around 2,500,000 shares.
